LOCK

On Tuesday, November 29th, 2022, at approximately 10:39 A.M., I responded to [REDACTED] for a drug overdose. I responded to [REDACTED] in an emergent manner utilizing patrol vehicle 16-01's emergency lights and sirens. Sgt. Vogt, Ptl. Jenkins, The Ocean City Fire Department (OCFD), and AtlantiCare Paramedics also responded.

Upon our arrival, Ptl. Jenkins and I attempted to make entry into [REDACTED] utilizing a front sliding door. The front sliding door was locked and was missing a door handle. Ptl. Jenkins and I went to the rear of [REDACTED] and attempted to open the back door. The back door was locked and blocked by a piece of wooden plywood from the inside. Ptl. Jenkins and I repeatedly announced ourselves and knocked on both the front and rear doors. We received no response from the caller or anyone inside of [REDACTED]. The Ocean City Fire Department arrived on-scene and we informed them of the locked doors and no response.

The Ocean City Fire Department forced entry into [REDACTED] at the rear door due to no response from anyone inside of [REDACTED] and repeated call-backs from Police Communications to the caller. The Ocean City Fire Department was able to gain entry into [REDACTED] and responding units made contact with Sierra D Halliday (Caller) and [REDACTED] in a bedroom area located inside. Halliday stated she was suffering from [REDACTED] and was transported to Shore Medical Center by the Ocean City Fire Department. After examination from responding medical personnel, [REDACTED] was permitted to sign a refusal form declining any further medical treatment.

No further police action was taken.

Initial Report:

On December 30, 2022, Lt. Finnegan, Ptl. Stryker, and I responded to 42 [REDACTED] for a report of a possible overdose.

Upon my arrival, I located Lauren Gayeski and her son [REDACTED], at the front door of their residence. [REDACTED] was alert and standing; however, he was lethargic and unable to walk or speak on his own. Lauren and I escorted [REDACTED] down their staircase and met with rescue in front of the residence.

Lauren explained that [REDACTED] has a substance abuse problem and suffers from depression. On this occasion, [REDACTED] used a screwdriver to access the families locked medicine cabinet. He then retrieved Lauren's prescribed [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] did not lose consciousness and was transported transported to Atlantic City Medical Center. Naloxone was not deployed on scene. [REDACTED]

A later spoke with Lauren over the phone and was advised that [REDACTED] once cleared by the hospital. Lauren added that [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

OD Mapping was completed for this incident. An L-3 Case has been created for all associated video evidence for this case, and email notifications have been sent to police records and IT.

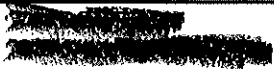

Upon arrival, I met with Matt Rosell, who directed me to the 2nd floor bedroom where [REDACTED] was located. [REDACTED] was semi conscious and per Rosell had been administered Naloxone prior to my arrival.

Randall stated that she took something, possibly cocaine, approximately an hour prior to our arrival. She was seen by the Ocean City Fire Department; but, ultimately signed a refusal for treatment.

Naloxone was left behind by OCFD as per AG Guidelines.

On 10/08/22, Sgt. Wilson, Ptl. Jenkins, and I, along with Ocean City Fire and Rescue, responded to [REDACTED] for the report of a possible overdose. While we were responding, we were informed by Communications that the caller stated she administered three separate doses of narcan to a 37 year old male and now he was conscious. It should be noted that this department is familiar with this residence and has been there numerous times due to the homeowner, [REDACTED].

Upon our arrival, we went inside and located [REDACTED] walking around. [REDACTED] denied overdosing and stated that no narcan had been administered to him. The fire department then took his vital signs and he denied medical attention.

While [REDACTED] was being evaluated, Ptl. Jenkins spoke with the caller, Sierra Halliday. Halliday stated she did call, however denied ever administering the narcan to [REDACTED]. She further stated that everything was alright and there was no need for medical treatment on [REDACTED].

After being urged several times by police and rescue units to go to the hospital, [REDACTED] still denied any treatment and signed a refusal. The fire department then left Halliday with another narcan just in case it was needed and all units cleared 1011 Bay Avenue.

At 11:05 AM, police and fire units were again called back to [REDACTED] for another possible overdose called in by Halliday (PD-22-39108). Ptl. Vivarelli was the first on scene and attempted to make contact with Halliday at the front door due to the front door handle being broken. Halliday was extremely intoxicated and was unable to open the door and walked away. At this time, Ptl. Dispatch further advised that [REDACTED] could have mixed Xanax and Alcohol together.

Police and Fire Units arrived simultaneously and were met outside by the victim's mother, Anna Scipione and her daughter Jennifer Vaughan. They explained that [REDACTED] has a history of drug and alcohol abuse and overdosed on Xanax and Alcohol. They further explained [REDACTED] was in his bedroom.

On Tuesday, September 20, 2022 at approximately 12:08 P.M, Central Communications dispatched a white male who was unconscious at the above location. Prior to my arrival Central broadcasted that it was a possible overdose due to prescription drugs and alcohol being found in the room. Upon receiving this

information I activated my overhead lights and sirens and started heading to the above location.

Upon my arrival, I grabbed go-bag number 6 and my personal medical kit from my vehicle and made my way up to room 311. Upon entering the room the victim's brother Paul Rixon was in the room. P. Rixon stated that he found his brother lying on the floor. I immediately went over to the victim on the floor and started asking basic medical questions to [REDACTED]. The main question I asked [REDACTED] was what did he take and how much alcohol was consumed. At this time, [REDACTED] pointed to the counter and a almost empty handle of Smirnoff could be seen along with two prescription bottles.

I immediately asked P.Rixon if he knew if his brother took any of the prescription medication and he stated he did not know. I grabbed a Naloxone from my medical kit and started assessing the patient. At this time the victim on the floor was identified as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was conscious and breathing. Due to [REDACTED] being conscious I elected to not use the Naloxone. While I was checking [REDACTED]'s pulse Fire and Rescue arrived on scene and started working on [REDACTED].

While Fire was working on [REDACTED] Sgt. Clark and I started asking P. Rixon standard questions. P. Rixon stated that he was at work when some of his family members started to get concerned about [REDACTED] not answering their calls. P. Rixon decided to check on his brother when he found him lying on the ground in his hotel room. P.Rixon further stated when he found his brother, he was unconscious and barely breathing. P.Rixon then shook his brother and was able to get him to regain consciousness. P. Rixon attempted to get his brother on his feet multiple times but had no success and ultimately had to call 911.

It should be noted that P. Rixon explained that [REDACTED] has been to rehab multiple times for alcohol abuse. I also asked P. Rixon if he knew if his brother had ever abused any other drugs (i.e opioids, methamphetamine, or any drug that is not prescribed to him). At this time P. Rixon stated that his brother never abused those types of drugs.

At this time Fire and Rescue decided to transport [REDACTED] to Shore Memorial Hospital to be evaluated. Sgt. Clark and I gathered all needed information and cleared. No further action was taken.

A mapping on OD Maps was completed at this time. The prescription drugs located on scene were prescribed to M. Rixon and transported with him to the hospital.

Fire department personnel arrived and administered a second dose of Narcan. A short time later the victim, [REDACTED], began to regain consciousness. Once fully alert, she admitted to ingesting methadone (which she is prescribed), marijuana, and Xanax earlier today. She stated she received the methadone from ARS Treatment Center in Mays Landing. On Saturday, May 28, 2022 at approximately 5:06 pm, I was dispatched to the area of [REDACTED] for the report of a possible overdose. Upon my arrival, Ptl. Mullineaux and I checked the area for the motor vehicle with the victim; who was later identified as [REDACTED]. The motor vehicle was a silver Audi S4 bearing New Jersey registration [REDACTED], which was parked in a legal parking space on the south side of the 88 [REDACTED]. At this time, we requested the Ocean City Fire Department come to our location to evaluate Merlock. We were able to make contact with Merlock who was in the passenger seat of the vehicle sitting upright, breathing, and alert. She would not give an affirmative answer as to whether she had used any substances today. At this time, we had Merlock step out of the vehicle to speak with us and a wax fold of suspected heroin had fallen off of her lap into the street. The wax fold was immediately collected and placed into a plastic evidence bag.

The Ocean City Fire Department arrived on scene and evaluated [REDACTED]. She stated that she did not need additional medical attention and sign a refusal form and a form stating she did not wish to receive any naloxone. She was offered naloxone from us multiple times as well but refused to accept any at this time. We then spoke to the driver and registered owner of the motor vehicle; Michael G. McCormick who stated that everything was okay with [REDACTED]s significant other; Owen Magelligan was also on

On March 22nd, 2022 at approximately 2:45 PM, Ptl. Elias, Ptl. Hall and I responded to the above location for an unconscious and unresponsive person. While responding, we were informed by Central Communication that CPR was in progress.

Upon arrival, we observed the victim, later identified as [REDACTED], laying on his bed unconscious and unresponsive. [REDACTED] was blue in the face and showing signs of agonal breathing and Ptl. Elias and Ptl. Hall were unable to read a pulse from [REDACTED].

As Ptl. Hall and Ptl. Elias started to deploy the Automated External Defibrillator from patrol bag #6, members of the Ocean City Fire Department arrived and took over medical treatment. [REDACTED] was moved from the bed to the hallway floor where aid could more easily be rendered. The Ocean City Fire Department deployed Narcan during the course of treating [REDACTED]. He eventually woke up and regained consciousness. He was evaluated by paramedics on scene and eventually signed a refusal for further medical assistance.

I spoke with the caller Lisa McGillis, who stated that they had just got back from lunch, and [REDACTED] was taking out trash for the building. McGillis then explained that [REDACTED] came back to the room and laid down on the bed, at this point McGillis thought [REDACTED] was sleeping. [REDACTED] then stated that she didn't hear [REDACTED] breathing anymore, and when she checked on him she noticed that his face had started to turn blue.

It should be noted that there was no contraband found in the apartment. An OD MAP form was filled out for this incident. An extra dose of Narcan was left with the McGillis, and she was instructed on how to use it.

On March 17th, 2022 at approximately 10:03 a.m., Ptl. Meyers and I responded to the above location for the report of a woman laying on the sidewalk, who appeared to be unresponsive. While responding, we were informed by Central Communication that a witness observed the victim being pushed out of vehicle and left on the sidewalk.

Upon arrival, Ptl. Harper and Ptl. Smith were already on scene, and Ptl. Smith was rendering aid to the victim, [REDACTED]. We observed [REDACTED] laying on the sidewalk, unresponsive, with shallow breathing, a needle mark on each of her hands, and she was foaming from the mouth. It should be noted that there was a brown paper bag with alcohol next to her (Seized and secured in the first floor evidence room). An ambulance was requested to assist the victim. Ptl. Harper took narcan from patrol bag #3 and Ptl. Smith administered the narcan through [REDACTED]'s left nostril.

At this time the Ocean City Fire Department arrived on scene and transported [REDACTED] to the Shore Medical Center.

Ptl. Meyers then spoke with the witness, who was subsequently identified as Maria Borjasortega. It should be noted that Borjasortega did not speak english, but her husband, Pedro Vasquez-Lopez, was on scene, and was able to translate. Borjasortega stated that she was sitting in a vehicle on the [REDACTED] when she witnessed a dark colored toyota forerunner, bearing New Jersey registration plates, drive down the street and park in front of [REDACTED]. Borjasortega then stated that she witnessed a heavysset, hispanic female, wearing a red dress, get out of the vehicle, and pull [REDACTED] on the sidewalk. Borjasortega then stated the hispanic female got back into her vehicle, and drove south, away from the scene. Borjasortega then explained that she could see [REDACTED] laying on the sidewalk, not moving. This information was broadcasted to patrol units to attempt to locate the vehicle.

Ptl. Harper, Ptl. Smith and I then walked the surrounding area to locate any other witnesses, or any surveillance footage. There were no other witness in the area. It should be noted that there was a doorbell camera located at [REDACTED]. Central Communication was able to make contact with the home owner of [REDACTED], who stated they had surveillance footage of the incident. The home owner then stated they would have the surveillance footage emailed to the police department. This footage is attached to the report. It should be noted that we were unable to make contact with the home owners of [REDACTED], to recover any surveillance footage.

After reviewing the surveillance footage of the incident, we noticed that the vehicle in question appeared to be a toyota sequoia, and not a toyota forerunner.

The detective bureau was notified of this incident and responded to Shore Medical Center.

Ptl. Meyers contacted nursing personnel at Shore Medical Center for an update on [REDACTED]'s condition. Emergency Room staff listed her condition as stable and stated she is being treated for suspected alcohol intoxication. It should be noted, toxicology reports have not been obtained at this time.

Upon my arrival I discovered a female, later identified as [REDACTED], laying up against the garden retaining wall of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] appeared to be asleep and was semi-conscious, but not responding to my verbal questioning. I continued to communicate with [REDACTED] while assessing her pulse and respirations. At this time, [REDACTED] had a very faint pulse, shallow breaths, and was foaming from the mouth.

At this time, I slowly repositioned [REDACTED] to the ground and laid her on her back. Patrolman Harper came to my assistance with Go Bag #3 and the decision to administer Narcan was made. She said that she called a LYFT to get to the liquor store but "blacked out" shortly after. 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Report:

On Sunday, January 16, 2021, at approximately 1:32 P.M, a [REDACTED] called 911 stating that he may have fallen at his residence due to him overdosing. The therapist who was later identified as Lisa Cordasco stated she was speaking with her client when she heard a, "Thump." Due to their conversation about him using drugs (heroin) all morning she believed he was actively overdosing. She then called Police communications.

Upon arriving, at the above listed address I grabbed my go-bag from the rear of my police vehicle 17-19. The main entrance at [REDACTED] was a see-through glass door. I was able to peer into the residence where I saw a white male [REDACTED] on his side. I checked to see if the front door was unlocked which it was not. I peered through the door again and I was able to see [REDACTED]'s chest rising and falling meaning he was breathing.

At this time Sgt. Clark Arrived on the scene, I informed him of the situation and went to check the rear of the property for a back door. There was a back door to the property which was unlocked. Upon entering the residence I went directly to [REDACTED] was in a good position and was agonal breathing. I immediately opened the front door to the residence so Sgt. Clark, Ptl. Harper and rescue services could enter the building.

A needle was found in [REDACTED]'s right hand commonly used to inject illegal substances. At this time, it was determined that [REDACTED] was overdosing. Sgt. Clark opened and handed me an up to date Narcan nasal spray that contained 4mg of Naloxone. I inspected the Narcan and administered the spray into [REDACTED]'s left nostril. At this time Fire and Rescue arrived on the scene. Approximately 1-3 minutes later [REDACTED] came too. [REDACTED] was confused due to him recently overdosing and there being so many people being in his residence.

At this time Lt. Fearnhead arrived on scene.

[REDACTED] at first was unable to make complete sentences and was in a daze. After a few minutes, [REDACTED] regained his wits and was able to make complete sentences. I explained to [REDACTED] that he had just overdosed and that the police and fire units were here because of that. I further explained to [REDACTED] that we had to use Narcan on him due to him overdosing. I asked [REDACTED] if he had ever overdosed before which he stated he had. Fire performed their initial assessments and confirmed that he was stable. [REDACTED] ultimately refused to be transported to Shore Memorial Hospital. Sgt. Clark and I attempted to get [REDACTED] to either go to the hospital or to get someone to come over to the residence. Sgt. Clark asked [REDACTED] if he wished to harm himself or others. He stated he did not. We offered to take him to Cape Regional Medical Center to speak with mental health professionals, but he did not wish to go.

At this time [REDACTED]'s father arrived on scene. I spoke to his father (Michael Kaiser) in the living room. I informed Michael Kaiser of the situation and suggested that he transport [REDACTED] to the hospital. After speaking with Michael Kaiser I went back to speak with [REDACTED]. I informed [REDACTED] that all police units were leaving and if he needed anything or someone to talk to, to contact the police department. I gathered all needed information and cleared.

During the initial response Sgt. Clark located a torn piece of a plastic bag commonly used to hold suspected heroin. He secured the bag and the needle [REDACTED] was holding in my patrol vehicle. After returning to Police Headquarters I placed the bag into an evidence bag and entered it into the BEAST system and put it into the evidence mailbox. The needle was discarded in the used sharps container. An OD mapping was created and submitted. A Naloxone Administration Reporting Form was also created and

On 1/5/2022 at approximately 3:44 AM, Ptl. Strunk, Lt. Randles and I responded to the above mentioned location for a report of a possible overdose. Upon our arrival we were met by the caller, John Blair, and taken to the victim upstairs.

Blair stated he fell asleep on the couch and woke up to smoke a cigarette. He claimed he noticed his friend, [REDACTED], sitting in a chair breathing abnormally so he attempted to wake him but was unsuccessful. Blair stated he knows [REDACTED] from a recovery group so he immediately suspected an overdose and called 911.

[REDACTED] was breathing, however, he was unconscious and unresponsive. OCFD personnel and paramedics on scene were able get [REDACTED] to regain consciousness by administering narkan and other medical practices.

Ptl. Strunk and I located a plastic bag in [REDACTED]'s bedroom with a white substance. In the living room where [REDACTED] was located, we found a glass pipe on the ground next to [REDACTED]. All substances were collected from the scene and taken to Police Headquarters. The items were entered into Beast, clearly marked as possible fentanyl and labeled to be destroyed.

After [REDACTED] regained consciousness he was further evaluated by the medics on scene and signed a refusal. [REDACTED] confirmed the substance in his room and in the glass pipe was [REDACTED] thanked first responders for their efforts.
