Good afternoon,

I'm writing regarding the venue transfer that Judge Susan Sheppard ordered relating to ALL of my husband, Jason Samaritano's cases. Jason has been contacted twice by his former probation officer from Atlantic County. Today he told Jason that he is supposed continue monitoring him. This is a complete conflict of interest since everything was transferred out of Atlantic County.

This is very similar to the situation we encountered when his cases were transferred to Atlantic County because of the conflict with Ocean County. Ocean County attempted to hold on to Jason's monitoring and violated him when those cases were transferred to Atlantic County. History seems to repeat itself.

Currently Jason's attorney is on suspension until a fine is paid. While he is on suspension I need communication from all of you since Jason is not permitted on the internet at this time until his sentencing. I want to make it very clear that since his arrest on December 5th, 2022 nobody from Recovery Court has reached out to Jason. It's our understanding that any violation of Recovery court is to be brought before a judge within 30 days. Clearly that did not happen. Furthermore, Jason was supposed to have graduated Recovery Court in July 2022 but that was held up after he filed charges against the Deputy Defender Scott Sherwood.

Jason was released from the Cumberland County Jail on November 3rd. The first time he heard from the Atlantic County probation officer was November 21st. I don't understand what exactly is going on since the judges order was for all his Atlantic County cases to be transferred to Cumberland County. Recovery Court was clearly put on that order. At minimum the Cumberland County Recovery Court Judge should have seen Jason within 30 days of the alleged violation. Please explain what Atlantic County's reason is for not sending the alleged VOP'S to Cumberland County and attempting to charge Jason now?

I have previously requested all of Jason's Recovery Court records and to date we have received nothing. I have a Durable Power of Attorney if you need a copy in order to supply these records to me. I have copied his attorney on this email to keep him informed as to what has been going on. I also copied the Cumberland County Prosecutor's Office and their Pretrial Monitoring division.

Please respond with your reasoning behind involvement in a case that was clearly transferred out of your venue and provide me with his entire recovery court file as I have requested it many times even prior to Jason's arrest on December 5th, 2022.

I received a text message this morning for my husband, Jason Samaritano. Jason supplied his phone number to pretrial services yet I continue to get his calls and text messages. I received a voicemail on November 22 by a person named John. John stated that Jason's pretrial monitoring was transferred to Ocean County.

I emailed you and the court on November 22nd and provided a letter from the former Ocean County Assignment Judge Marlene Lynch Ford which states our conflict with the entire Ocean Vicinage. I also suggested that if Jason's monitoring has to be transferred that Burlington County would be a possibility since we see know conflict relating to that vicinage.

I asked for clarification regarding the court order as it states "no internet". Wifi is used for our cell phones, T.V.'s etc. Therefore, the term "internet" is too broad and requires more specification. I provided court transcripts that are contradictory and yet I have heard nothing back from anyone.

This morning I received a text message for Jason from pretrial services and I have attached it to this email. I don't mind receiving these messages as long as Jason is also receiving them which he is not. Good morning,

We received a call this morning that stated that my husband Jason Samaritano's pretrial monitoring was transferred to Ocean County. As we all are aware, Jason and I have a conflict with the entire Ocean County vicinage. This conflict is well documented in the previous Ocean County Assignment Judge's letter to us. I have attached a copy for your reference.

I also want to mention that I have emailed previously regarding the wording in Judge D'Arrigo's November 3, 2023 order regarding the pretrial monitoring conditions as they relate to the internet. The purpose for my inquiry is because pretrial monitoring had wanted to zoom meet with Jason. Zoom requires internet access.

We obtained the court transcripts from that court date and they are very contradicting. The judge mentions some zoom communication with pretrial services may be permitted on page 40 of the transcripts. He also states on page 37 "no postings on the internet that you think or hope they would read." That statement indicates that other internet usage is okay. However, then on page 40 after the zoom statement he says to stay off the internet.

The issue with the internet was based on the social media posts as they related to Judges & prosecutors. Internet is vital part of society today. We have out of state relatives and one son still in high school and another in college. Those relationships require email access with the schools etc. Disallowing my husband internet access altogether is beyond what the states recommendation was.

We ask that you reconsider the wording of the November 3, 2023 court order. We also would like the court to know that we are agreeable to Jason's pretrial monitoring being transferred to Burlington County, where these cases should have been transferred to originally.

I received a text message this morning for my husband, Jason Samaritano. Jason supplied his phone number to pretrial services yet I continue to get his calls and text messages. I received a voicemail on November 22 by a person named John. John stated that Jason's pretrial monitoring was transferred to Ocean County.

I emailed you and the court on November 22nd and provided a letter from the former Ocean County Assignment Judge Marlene Lynch Ford which states our conflict with the entire Ocean Vicinage. I also suggested that if Jason's monitoring has to be transferred that Burlington County would be a possibility since we see know conflict relating to that vicinage.

I asked for clarification regarding the court order as it states "no internet". Wifi is used for our cell phones, T.V.'s etc. Therefore, the term "internet" is too broad and requires more specification. I provided court transcripts that are contradictory and yet I have heard nothing back from anyone.

This morning I received a text message for Jason from pretrial services and I have attached it to this email. I don't mind receiving these messages as long as Jason is also receiving them which he is not. Please update your records and let us know where Jason is actual scheduled to do his pretrial monitoring. His cell phone number is 609-709-0714.

Good morning,

We received a call this morning that stated that my husband Jason Samaritano's pretrial monitoring was transferred to Ocean County. As we all are aware, Jason and I have a conflict with the entire Ocean County vicinage. This conflict is well documented in the previous Ocean County Assignment Judge's letter to us. I have attached a copy for your reference.

I also want to mention that I have emailed previously regarding the wording in Judge D'Arrigo's November 3, 2023 order regarding the pretrial monitoring conditions as they relate to the internet. The purpose for my inquiry is because pretrial monitoring had wanted to zoom meet with Jason. Zoom requires internet access.

We obtained the court transcripts from that court date and they are very contradicting. The judge mentions some zoom communication with pretrial services may be permitted on page 40 of the transcripts. He also states on page 37 "no postings on the internet that you think or hope they would read." That statement indicates that other internet usage is okay. However, then on page 40 after the zoom statement he says to stay off the internet.

The issue with the internet was based on the social media posts as they related to Judges & prosecutors. Internet is vital part of society today. We have out of state relatives and one son still in high school and another in college. Those relationships require email access with the schools etc. Disallowing my husband internet access altogether is beyond what the states recommendation was.

We ask that you reconsider the wording of the November 3, 2023 court order. We also would like the court to know that we are agreeable to Jason's pretrial monitoring being transferred to Burlington County, where these cases should have been transferred to originally.

I reached out to you regarding the cell phone that you obtained from State Police Detective David Foote. I used the fax number that was provided on the website. However, I did not receive a response. My husband, Jason Samaritano, was able to pick up the cell phone that you investigated with the phone number of 609-709-0714. However, there was some damage to the phone, the case and the SIM card was missing. In court on November 3rd, 2023 assistant prosecutor Lesley Snock from Cumberland County stated that my husband could retrieve the phone with the number I indicated above, but that she was going to continue to investigate the other phone with the number of 908-783-3284. I have called that phone number and apparently that phone is being used by someone and that woman explained to me that someone from the office gave it to her. So, as you can see I am a bit confused about where this other phone is. I copied

the Cumberland County Prosecutor's Office on this email with the hope that someone can clarify what has happened to the other cell phone that was confiscated by detective Foote. My husband's attorney Kenneth Rosellini is also copied in this email.

The damaged phone was purchased brand new on June 2, 2022 so it was only 6 months old when the detective confiscated it. I do not know where this phone was stored up until the time you received it or if it was damaged in your care or after. If someone could please tell me how to go about filing a formal report regarding the damage. Jason did report it to the prosecutor's office evidence department and the business card of Detective Ashley Cornwall was given to him. All of that information is attached to this email.

So to outline what we need to know is:

- Where is the phone with the number of 908-783-3284?
- Why did a woman answer that phone and tell me that the office gave her the phone?
- How do we get the phone 609-709-0714 fixed and who is covering that cost?
- Who is responsible for replacing the broken case?
- We also need a copy of the warrant indicating what was allowed to be retrieved from the phones that were confiscated

I noticed on page one of your report that it clearly states that there was no damage to the phone and it also refers to the SIM card and states all its identifiers and then states that it was not examined. Did you place it back into the phone? We need to know where that SIM card is and who did the damage to the case and phone. I appreciate your time and cooperation and look forward to hearing back from you.
