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1. What is the primary operating radio frequency band (VHF, UHF, UHF-T, 7/800) for your:
 - a. Police Department – **Lacey Township Police Dept operates on UHF conventional frequency of 460.400**
 - b. Fire Department
 - c. EMS

2. What is your migration plan once the 500MHz Trunked Radio System is decommissioned by Federal Regulation in 2021? **Although our frequency is not directly affected by the decommissioning of the 500MHz frequency, our police department will lose the access to county wide agencies that operate on the trunked radio system. Our migration plan includes capital requests to purchase mobile and portable radios over the next three years which will allow us to be operational on the 700MHz system as soon as possible.**

3. Do you currently own or plan to purchase radios capable of operating on the County's new p25 700 MHz Trunked Radio System? **We currently have (4) portable radios and (7) mobile radios capable of operating on the system. We currently plan to purchase mobile and portable radios over the next three years which will allow us to be operational on the 700MHz system as soon as possible.**

4. Do you currently own or plan to purchase radios capable of AES Encryption? **We currently have (4) portable radios and (7) mobile radios capable of AES Encryption and plan to purchase only those capable portable/mobile radios moving forward.**

5. Do you have a need to have interoperable radio communication with State agencies? **Yes we require interoperable radio communication with State agencies including, but not limited to communications with the New Jersey State Forest Fire Service and New Jersey State Police.**
