Beachwood Fire Department:

2. What is your migration plan once the 500MHz Trunked Radio System is decommissioned by Federal Regulation in 2021?

Beachwood Fire Department has allocated funds through Capital Projects that we are prepared to spend on new radio system.

3. Do you currently own or plan to purchase radios capable of operating on the County's new p25 700 MHz Trunked Radio System?

We have money already in place and will purchase radios when the switch is made. We also did not wish to buy radios for a system not in place or buy "dual band radios" in anticipation of the switch, only to have the 500 mhz portion become obsolete in time. Our current 500 mhz equipment is owned by us and is in excellent condition and working order. All new 700 MHz equipment will be purchased.

4. Do you currently own or plan to purchase radios capable of AES Encryption?
Open to discussion on need for this at meeting. I do not believe our current radios are encrypted.

5. DO you have a need to have interoperable radio communication with State agencies?
Currently the Beachwood Fire Department has second radios in our trucks that communicate with State Agencies (State Forrest Fire for example...and TOMS RIVER Township). We would continue to use these, but it is our understanding that Toms River will be changing as well (unknown if 700 mhz or not). If needed we planned on buying limited dual band radios for officers/ crew leaders to communicate on mutual calls out of our area.
