Re: Open Public Records Act/Common Law Records Request

Dear Sir/Madam:

The City of Woodbury received your request for records pursuant to the Open Public Records Act (OPRA) and New Jersey common law. Your records request was for the incident reports for the 2018 and 2019 incidents involving overdoses and Narcan deployments previously identified in response to your prior OPRA/common law request.

Response to Common Law Request

The common law right to access public records depends on three requirements: (1) the records must be common law public documents, *Nero v. Hyland*, 76 N.J. 213, 222 (1978); (2) the person seeking access must "establish an interest in the subject matter of the material," *South Jersey Publishing Co. v. New Jersey Expressway Auth.*, 124 N.J. 478, 487 (1991); and (3) the citizen's right to access "must be balanced against the State's interest in preventing disclosure." *Loigman v. Kimmelman*, 102 N.J. 98 (1986).

After consultation with the City Solicitor, we have determined that you have failed to establish a proper interest in the requested records. Your common law request is therefore denied.

Copies of the previously identified records are enclosed. Please note that, after consultation with the City Solicitor, portions of the identified record(s) have been redacted as follows:

1. **Privacy/Personal Information.** Portions of the identified record(s) containing personal information for which identified individuals have a reasonable expectation of privacy have been redacted. N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1; Executive Order No. 21 (McGreevey 2002); *Paff v. Ocean County Prosecutor's Office*, 235 N.J. 1 (2018); *Brennan v. Bergen County Prosecutor's Office*, 233 N.J. 330 (2018); *In the Matter of the New Jersey State Fireman's Association*, 230 N.J. 258 (2017); *Burnett v. County of Bergen*, 198 N.J. 408 (2009); *Nelson v. N.J. Department of Law & Public Safety*, No. 2013-124 (GRC 2014); *Merino v. Borough of Ho-Ho-Kus*, No. 2003-110 (GRC 2004).
2. **Protected Health Information.** Portions of the identified record(s) containing protected health information exempt from disclosure pursuant to the Privacy Rule implemented pursuant to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and Executive Order No. 26, paragraph 4.b.1 (McGreevey 2002) (exempting from disclosure "information relating to medical, psychiatric or psychological history, diagnosis, treatment or evaluation") have been redacted.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the City of Woodbury to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.

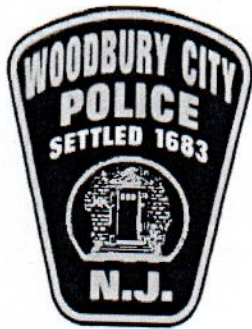

On Saturday 1/27/18 at approximately 1259 hours I was dispatched to regard to an overdose. Upon my arrival along with GC EMS (Pierce/Thomas) and Sgt. Beckett and Det. Cacciola I met with to inquire further about what happened.

As GC EMS started to tend to who was unresponsive sitting upright on the living room chair, stated that has a drug history and believes he overdosed. stated that she dropped off at Carneys Auto Center (1102 Mantua Ave, Wenonah) at roughly 800 hours for work. She stated that arrived home at 1230 hours and was fumbling around with his shoes in the living room. She informed that she was in the bathroom and heard in the living room chair with heavily labored

breathing at roughly 1250 hours. could not wake him up and called 911. GC EMS administered one dose of nasal naloxone to who was then safely placed onto the floor. remained unresponsive and as per GC EMS, they cannot administer more than one dose of naloxone. At this time I administered one dose of nasal naloxone retrieved from Sgt. Beckett's vehicle.

 awoke shortly thereafter and was transported to Inspira Medical for further evaluation. He stated that he took 4, 15mg pills of oxycontin to which he is prescribed for pain. denies taking any illegal substance. Upon talking to after was transported attempting to retrieve more information, grabbed wallet which revealed two small clear glassine baggies each containing white powder believed to be C.D.S. These baggies were properly transported back to headquarters and placed into the Beast evidence system and placed into the temporary evidence locker. An evidence form and naloxone administration form were completed and attached to this report. was advised to contact police should she find anything further in the residence. There no signs of illicit drug use inside the apartment.

 was advised of the outreach programs available to him should he wish to seek assistance. At this time there was no further police action required and I was able to clear the call and resume patrol.

At approximately 1453hrs Sgt. Beckett contacted the Inspira emergency room who advised signed himself out of the hospital AMA (against medical advice).

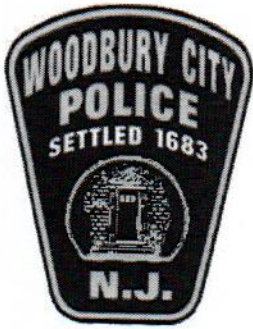

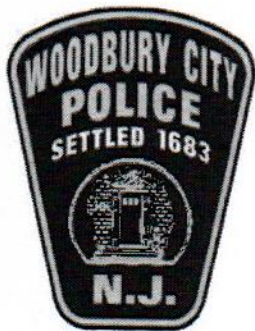

I retrieved Naloxone Hydrochloride (which is an opioid antagonist) from my patrol vehicle (#311) and brought it on scene. I assembled the Naloxone kit and administered it nasally to . I did not observe any positive reaction to and it seemed his breathing became less. At this time Gloucester County EMS (GCEMS) arrived on scene.

GCEMS then took over the scene and subsequently administered another dose of Naloxone. GC Paramedics arrived on scene and eventually regained consciousness. was able to walk himself to a stretcher and was transported to Inspira Hospital.

advised Ptl. Wills #3043 that bought heroin from a male named . stated that lived in the Woodlake apartment complex, in one of the apartments closest to Hunter St. stated that was the heroin dealer for the entire apartment complex. No further information was provided. All parties were advised that a report would be made of the incident.

The Naloxone Administration Reporting Form was completed of this incident.

On 02/16/2018 at 1:05am I contacted the Inspira Hospital emergency room charge nurse who advised was still in their custody and doing well.

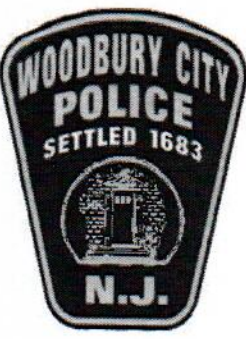

informed Ptl. Byerley that she found [redacted] laying on her stomach face down in the hallway near the top of the stairs. [redacted] was making a gargling sound and was having difficulty breathing. [redacted] then rolled over so she was now laying on her back. [redacted] applied cold water under the neck and armpits of [redacted] hoping to revive her. [redacted] then called 911 for assistance. [redacted] and her two children, [redacted], were inside the apartment when Stein was found unconscious.

Gloucester County EMS continued to perform CPR and also administered another dose of Narcan. EMS personnel stated they found a blue unmarked empty wax fold believed to have once contained heroin inside [redacted] mouth. EMS then removed the wax fold from [redacted] mouth and turned it over to me. Ptl. Mitchell located an empty Newport cigarette box in [redacted] purse which was laying next to her. The following items were located inside the box:

- one red plastic heat sealed bag empty in which believed to once contain crack cocaine
- one glass pipe cut off at both ends stuffed with a copper mesh substance commonly used to inhale CDS

I immediately took custody of these items and secured them inside a clear evidence bag. GCEMS was able to get a pulse on Stein and transported her to Inspira Hospital. Detective Phillips 3025 arrived on scene to assist.

Det. Phillips, Ptl. Mitchell, and I then went to Inspira Hospital to conduct a follow up. Also note that the following prescription medications were located in [redacted] purse and turned over to Hospital Staff.

- Pantoprazole 40mg
- Cabapentin 300mg
- Diazepam 10mg

After documenting and photographing the above medications they were then returned to [redacted] property. I returned to police headquarters and entered the found drug paraphernalia and photographs into the BEAST evidence system. A department case report was printed out and placed in the report bin.

At 2229 hours, Ptl. Mitchell and I followed up with hospital staff in regards to [redacted] condition. Hospital staff advised us that [redacted] is alive and is being transferred to the Intensive Care Unit.

Please note that Det. Phillips contacted Det. C. McCausland from the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office and advised her of the incident. Det. McCausland stated she would not be responding at this time. I also

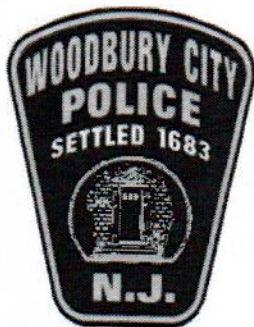

NARRATIVE

On Sunday, 04/01/2018 at approximately 15:17 hrs, Woodbury Units were dispatched to Woodlake Apartments for the report of a female who was unconscious and turning blue. County Dispatch advised that it was unknown if the female was breathing and if it was an overdose.

Upon my arrival, SLEO Trotz #3115 was on location administering CPR. I observed the female's face to be turning blue and she was breathing very shallowly. I then administered one (1) dose of Nasal Narcan (2mg) which I obtained from my patrol vehicle (321). Immediately after receiving the Narcan the female opened her eyes and began waking up. I asked what she did with the used heroin bags and she stated that she flushed them down the toilet because she was afraid to get in trouble. Sandra stated that they both used heroin in the apartment.

Gloucester County EMS transported to Inspira after she became conscious. After observing signs of heroin use and her potential for also overdosing after using the same heroin used, was also transported to Inspira for an evaluation.

At approximately 2000 hrs, I followed up with nursing staff at Inspira to inquire about and condition. Inspira staff advised that both females were okay and were already discharged.
