Stockton University's Open Public Records Act (OPRA) Custodian received your OPRA Request on July 13, 2020. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request is July 22, 2020.

Your OPRA Request sought access to the following:

All email communications, as well as all attachments, to and from President Harvey Kesselman regarding MLK research study commissioned by the NJ DEP.

Please search the following terms for the period of time from 1-1-2016 through 7-10-2020:

"Martin Luther King" plus "Camden"

OPRA allows custodians extensions of time to respond pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5.i. Specifically, OPRA states that, "the requestor shall be advised by the custodian when the record can be made available. If the record is not made available by that time, access shall be deemed denied."

On March 9, 2020, New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy issued Executive Order 103 which declared a Public Health emergency, and the Declaration was extended on April 7 under Executive Order 119, on May 6, 2020 under Executive Order 138, on June 4, 2020 under Executive Order 151, and on July 2, 2020 under executive order 162, which also stated that previously entered Executive Orders remain "in full force and effect".

In addition, on March 20, 2020, Governor Murphy signed into law P.L. 2020, c. 10, which amends OPRA to suspend the 7-day response deadline when “a state of emergency, public health emergency, or state of local disaster emergency” has been declared. N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(i)(2).

Concurrently, University employees, including the OPRA staff, began operating remotely on March 18, 2020 (and continue to do so), in accordance with the above-mentioned Executive Orders and the University’s precautionary measures to protect its students, employees, and community during the COVID-19 global pandemic. The implementation of remote operations and the recent implementation of furloughs of State employees have impacted the scope and timing of the University’s OPRA responses.

Your request requires an extension of time to fulfill of an additional seventeen (17) business days, until August 14, 2020.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied, you have a right to challenge the decision to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (“GRC”) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511; by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625; by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us; or, at its web site located at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about OPRA. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
