Addition clarifying information received: It is a private address, and the home of Rebecca Halbach and Brandon Leconey, who were recently arrested for having 100 plus dead dogs in their home with a young child living there on August 28th of this year. I am seeking any complaints made by individuals, school officials or law enforcement about the property or Rebecca Halbach's two children. Last year the little girl ran into a 7-11 seeking help and telling the story about having dead animals all over her house and that she couldn't live there anymore. The police brought her back to the house and told the 7-11 workers everything was kosher, when we know now that it was far from kosher.
