You have recently stated your opposition to marijuana legalization and the marijuana industry. The marijuana industry is following the playbook of the tobacco industry in trying to get our kids addicted. They market to young people with potent edibles such as cookies, candies, "gummie bears," sodas, brownies and ice cream. Their advertising uses cartoon characters and Santa Claus and images from popular kids' movies.

There is now crystalline THC that is 99.99% THC. Many recent marijuana products are advertised as being 94 or 95% THC. This is far higher than the "Woodstock Weed" of years past that was 2-3% THC. However, the public perception of marijuana is based on the marijuana of the past.

The recent science shows that marijuana use causes mental illness and addiction and many other problems.

The recent science

The 2016 United States Surgeon General report on addiction states that marijuana is a serious threat to the physical and mental health of our children and that its use is a major threat to public safety. [FN1]

The American Psychiatric Association reports that current evidence supports, at a minimum, a strong association of marijuana use with the onset of psychiatric disorders. [FN2] Mental illness leads to crime, homelessness and enormous costs. It is also not good for business.

The National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) research shows that 30 percent of marijuana users may develop some degree of problem use that can include addiction. Among young users, the drug may

reduce thinking, memory, and learning functions. Marijuana use has also been linked to mental health problems, such as depression, anxiety, and suicidal thoughts among teens. [FN3]

In 2017, the National Academy of Sciences (NAS) landmark report written by top scientists concluded after a review of over 10,000 peer-reviewed academic articles, that marijuana use is connected to, among other problems:

1. respiratory problems;
 2. mental health issues (like psychosis, social anxiety, and thoughts of suicide);
 3. increased risk of car accidents;
 4. progression to and dependence on other drugs, including studies showing connections to cocaine and heroin use;
 5. learning, memory, and attention loss (possibly permanent in some cases); and
- low birth weight. [FN4]

A study discussed in a 2017 article in Scientific American shows that people who had consumed marijuana before age 18 developed schizophrenia approximately 10 years earlier than others. The higher the frequency of use the earlier the age of schizophrenia onset. Neither alcohol use nor genetics predicted an earlier time of inception, but marijuana did. Marijuana use during puberty is a major risk factor for schizophrenia. The more marijuana you take - and the higher the potency - the greater the risk. [FN5]

A recent study found that marijuana use in youth is linked to bipolar symptoms in young adults.[FN6]

Recent research shows that marijuana use is associated with an increased risk of prescription and opioid misuse disorders. [FN7] We now have an opiate epidemic. Lets not make it worse.

According to the annual 2017 Quest Diagnostics Drug Testing Index™ the use of drugs in our national workforce reached the highest drug test positivity rate in 12 years. This was an analysis of more than 10,000,000 workplace drug test results. The marijuana positive rate has increased dramatically in the last three years with increases in the “recreational” marijuana states of Colorado and Washington being double the national average. For Colorado it was a increase of 11% and Washington 9%. [FN8] Do you want more drug users in our workplaces?

There are many other problems that come with marijuana commercialization. Please read the recent editorial from the Colorado Springs Gazette about the situation in Colorado. [FN9]. They note that:

- . Residential neighborhoods and other areas “reek of marijuana.”
- . A homelessness growth rate that ranks among the highest rates in the country as homeless substance users migrate there for easy access to pot.
- . A doubling in the number of drivers involved in fatal crashes who tested positive for marijuana.
- . More marijuana in schools than teachers and administrators ever feared. Drug violations reported / Colorado's K-12 schools have increased 45% even as the combined number of all other violations is fallen.
- . An increase in high school drug violations of 71% since legalization.
- . School suspensions for drugs increased 45%.

7. The National Survey on Drug Use and Health found Colorado ranks first in the country for marijuana use among teens, scoring well above the national average.

Do you want this for your neighborhoods, your schools and your kids? NO!!

Dear Colleague,

As Mayor of Point Pleasant Beach, our town was the first New Jersey municipality to pass an ordinance banning marijuana sales in our community. I am pleased to report that many other municipalities have followed, from Bergen County to Cape May.

With the Legislature considering a new bill to legalize marijuana in the coming months, it is important that local officials take action now to protect their communities and families from a new "Big Tobacco" type industry that seeks to profit at the expense of the health and safety of our residents.

Make no mistake, marijuana legalization brings a multitude of public health concerns, including increased youth drug use, increased motor vehicle accidents and higher numbers of minority arrests. And with the Garden State in the grips of an opioid crisis, we cannot forget that the CDC has found that marijuana users are nearly three times more likely to be addicted to heroin.

Looking at what's happening in other states, New Jersey elected officials should be very alarmed. In Washington State and Colorado, where marijuana has been legal for five years, pot use has increased, particularly among children. According to the National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH), Colorado is now the top state in the country for first time users of marijuana in youth and adults.

Local officials also need to be concerned with the impact of increased marijuana use on the roads. Pot-related car crashes continue to skyrocket in the era of legalization and widespread commercialization of marijuana. In Colorado, marijuana-impaired drivers involved in fatal crashes have more than doubled since 2013, the year after the state

voted to legalize recreational use of the drug, according to an analysis by the Denver Post. That same study also found that Colorado saw a 40 percent increase in the number of all drivers involved in fatal crashes between 2013 and 2016, and a 145 percent increase in the number of marijuana-impaired drivers involved in fatal crashes in the same period.

Additionally, we've seen significant proof that marijuana legalization is not the step forward for social justice we have been promised. In fact, it's just the opposite, as the marijuana industry routinely targets vulnerable communities as its profit centers. Just take a look at Denver, where the number of pot shops is greater than the number of McDonalds and Starbucks combined. According to the Colorado Department of Public Safety, in the two years after Colorado legalized marijuana, the number of Hispanic and black kids arrested for marijuana-related offenses rose 29 and 58 percent, respectively.

In the same period, the number of white kids being arrested for identical crimes dropped eight percent.

Some say that legalizing and taxing the drug will result in increased budget revenues for the state and New Jersey towns. However, in Colorado, tax revenue gained from marijuana was much smaller than promised and the Denver Post reported pot taxes wouldn't solve the state's budget problems. Additionally, the revenue argument doesn't take into account the long-term, well-documented costs of increased marijuana use on communities. A recent study showed the public health costs of legalization are at least 125% of all revenues collected. These expenses come from increased law enforcement, workplace accidents, stoned driving crashes, and hospital admissions.

As Executive Director of New Jersey Responsible Approaches to Marijuana Policy (NJ-RAMP) -- a grassroots coalition of medical doctors, community groups, drug prevention professionals, business owners, law enforcement officers and parents -- I am working with municipalities to adopt common sense measures to protect their communities from the negative consequences of legalization.

In the next few months, it is critical for municipalities to take action to protect their communities by passing local zoning ordinances to prohibit pot shops and other related businesses. I am happy to work with you and your town officials in developing these policies and discussing the issues with your community.

I hope you will join me in protecting your town and stopping the marijuana industry from wreaking havoc on your community. New Jersey cannot afford another Big Tobacco industry profiting at the expense of our communities, families and children.

New Jersey Cannabis Reform Takes Major Step Forward...But Where Do We Go From Here?

November 26, 2018 was "Cyber Monday 2018" for the online retail sector, but for interested parties here in New Jersey it may well become known as "Cannabis Monday 2018" with approvals on that date by the State Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee (SBA) and Assembly Appropriations Committee (AAC) of multiple cannabis-related bills. This recent action has set the stage for full legislative passage as early as December 17, 2018.

The SBA and AAC approved S2703/A4497, the adult-use cannabis legalization bill some refer to as the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory and Expungement Aid Modernization Act (NJCREMA). Also approved were two medical marijuana expansion bills (via a combined S10/A10 and S2426/A3740), and S3205/A3205, a bill revising procedures surrounding the expungement of records of certain convictions, including those related to cannabis. The medical marijuana expansion bills were also approved by the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee.

Under NJCREMA, four classes of licenses will be created: Class 1 (Cannabis Grower License); Class 2 (Cannabis Processor License); Class 3 (Cannabis Wholesaler License); Class 4 (Cannabis Retail License). NJCREMA also provides for a certified cannabis handler to deliver certain cannabis products on behalf of a licensed Class 4 cannabis retailer, as well as certain licensing measures established by the Office of Minority, Disabled Veterans and Women Cannabis Business Development to promote the licensing of "persons from socially and economically disadvantaged communities, and minority owned and women's owned businesses." Other NJCREMA highlights include a proposed 12% excise tax on cannabis products and the creation of the Cannabis

Regulatory Commission, to be tasked with certain action items such as adopting rules to regulate and prohibit advertising and marketing that appeals to minors, and instituting strict packaging and labeling requirements.

The medical bills mirror the licensing classes promulgated under NJCREMA and amend the definition of an "alternative treatment center" to be "an organization issued a permit by the commission to operate as a (i) medical cannabis cultivator, (ii) medical cannabis manufacturer, (iii) medical cannabis dispensary, or (iv) clinical registrant." Previously, the alternative treatment centers were required to be vertically integrated, performing all facets of cultivation, processing and dispensing. The medical bills raise the amount of dried cannabis that patients are permitted to purchase each month (from 2 ounces to 2.5 ounces commencing January 1, 2019 and ending July 1, 2019, before ramping up to 3 ounces on or after July 1, 2019). Additionally, the 6.625% sales tax will be phased out after five years and provides certain job-related protections for employee-patients.

December 17, 2018 is the first date that these bills may be brought to the full Senate and Assembly to vote on full passage, which would then require Governor Murphy's signature. It is likely that the State will release the additional medical cannabis Requests for Applications (RFAs) upon the passage of the medical expansion bills. These additional RFAs were initially intended to be released in Fall 2018 and Winter 2019, following modifications to the medical bill, however the delay in awarding the six alternative treatment center licenses (from the August 2018 applications), and the delay in passing such modifications, have pushed the release dates back.
