We are pleased to inform you that the Peter J. McGuire Memorial and Gravesite, located in Arlington Cemetery at 1620 Cove Road, in Pennsauken Township, Camden County, will be considered by the New Jersey State Review Board for Historic Sites for nomination to the New Jersey and National Registers of Historic Places. Both Registers are official lists of historic properties worthy of preservation. Listing in both Registers provides recognition and assists in preserving our Nation's heritage.

Listing provides recognition of the community's historic importance and assures protective review of public projects that might adversely affect the character of the historic property. If the Peter J. McGuire Memorial and Gravesite is listed in the National Register, certain federal investment tax credits for rehabilitation and other provisions may apply. Attached please find a notice that explains, in greater detail, the results of listing in the New Jersey and National Registers and that describes the rights and procedures by which an owner may comment on or object to listing.

For private property owners, listing in the New Jersey and National Registers does not mean that limitations will be placed on the properties by the State or Federal governments. Within the limits of municipal zoning laws, private property owners are free to utilize, renovate, alter, sell or demolish their properties. Public visitation rights are not required of owners nor will the State or Federal governments attach restrictive covenants to the properties or seek to acquire them. All public undertakings affecting registered properties are subject to review and approval in accordance with New Jersey State Register Law.

You are invited to attend the New Jersey State Review Board meeting on July 19, 2018 at which time the nomination will be considered. The meeting is scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m., in the **Department of Environmental Protection Public Hearing Room, 1st floor, 401 East State Street, Trenton, New Jersey**. A copy of the meeting agenda and a copy of the draft

nomination to be considered will be posted on the Historic Preservation Office website; go to <http://www.nj.gov/dep/hpo/> and follow the links to the State Review Board meeting.
