Dear Ms. Logan,

The Logan Twp. Police Dept. received your Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request (to include the Common Law right of access) on 12/20/2022. The official Records Custodian, Chief Joseph Flatley, has a seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request, making that deadline 12/30/2022. This response to your request is being provided to you on 12/21/2022, the first business day after the custodian's receipt of said request.

Your OPRA request sought access to the following:

- Records requested: All police reports, calls, complaints and court matters related to this address, that originate from the neighbor at 58 Hancock St, Vlad Chernov and his wife. The response is as follows:
 - All police reports – All police reports from incidents related to 56 Hancock St that originated from 58 Hancock St, Vladislav Chernov or Baira Chernov for the period 1/1/2018 through the present are attached.
 - “Calls”: The Logan Township Police Department utilizes the Gloucester County Communications Center to provide Dispatch Services. No such records exist.
 - “Complaints”: In our experience, “Complaints” typically refers to “Criminal Complaints, Disorderly Persons Offenses or Traffic Summonses.” All related complaints affiliated in any way with the above noted police reports are attached. Should this not be the documentation you are seeking, please advise what it is that we may assist you with.
 - “Court Matters” are not maintained by the Logan Township Police Department. No such records exist. (I recommend that you contact the Logan Township Municipal Court to see if these records are available through their office.)

Additional Information:

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the Logan Township Police

Department to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
