NARRATIVE

On the above date and time patrols were dispatched to 58 Hancock Street for a report of a noise complaint. Residents from 56 Hancock Street were the complainants with 58 Hancock Street being the accused. Note, this is an on going issue that has gone back and forth between the two residences over numerous months. On this date, patrols had been dispatched two times prior in the evening for noise complaints (2022009402, 2022009398).

The first time I responded, Vladislav Chernov of 58 Hancock Street, stated the residents of 56 Hancock Street were having a loud party with a live band in the backyard causing too much noise. Upon police arrival no music was initially heard until we went to the front of the residence where the music was barely audible. I spoke with Shanell West of 56 Hancock Street and advised her of the noise complaint, however she was advised that the music was not being deemed excessive at that time and it could continue at a low volume.

After clearing from the initial call, 58 Hancock Street called police again wanting police to come inside of the residence to hear the music coming from 56 Hancock Street. I responded back to 58 Hancock Street where I was invited inside of the residence to better hear the "loud music". Even in the rear interior of 58 Hancock Street, the music coming from 56 Hancock Street was barely audible. I advised Vladislav that I would not be signing complaints against 56 Hancock Street at that time and that they were welcome to do so on their own during regular court hours. Vladislav and his spouse were not happy with my answer and became highly agitated and upset stating that I had to issue them a summons because it is the law and they did not approve of the noise level. They were advised otherwise, however I told them that I would again speak to Shanell regarding the music. Still not happy with my response, Vladislav retrieved a speaker and stated that since I would not shut down the music at 56 Hancock then he would blast his own music loudly in his backyard. I told Vladislav that he was free to do so as long as the music was kept at an acceptable level.

At 2103 hours on this date, 56 Hancock Street called police regarding loud music now coming from the backyard of 58 Hancock Street. I spoke with the residents of 56 Hancock Street who stated there was a speaker in the backyard of 58 Hancock Street playing loud music specifically with the speaker close to their fence facing their backyard. The music was audible from the front of the residence and when I went into the backyard of 56 Hancock Street it was obvious that loud music was being directed

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at their residence from 58 Hancock Street. Note, no one was in the back yard of 58 Hancock Street where the music was playing and the residents of 58 Hancock were in their living room watching television. I then spoke with Vladislav where he was advised to either shut the music off or be issued a summons. Vladislav accused police of siding with 56 Hancock Street and were not being fair. Vladislav stated he would turn the music off but would be contacting his lawyer to make complaints against the Logan Twp. Police.

Patrols then cleared from the scene for a third time with no further incident.
