NARRATIVE

At the above date and time, patrols were dispatched for a noise complaint originating at 56 Hancock St. The caller, resident at 58 Hancock St. stated a young adult male at the residence had been playing the drums for over two hours with the windows open. It should be noted the residences are townhomes which are connected.

Upon arrival, I stood outside of 58 Hancock St to assess the noise level coming from the residence. I noticed the windows to be partially open, however, the noise from the drums was not unreasonable or offensive. I then spoke with the caller, Baira Chernov, who stated she works from home and was bothered by the noise created by the drumming next door. She invited me in to the residence to hear the drumming from her point of reference. While the drumming could be heard from inside her residence at the front of her home, the noise was not in my opinion at a level which was unreasonable. Mrs. Chernov then lead me to the rear of the residence where the workspace is located and explained she works from home. She stated it is loud at this point of the house because she is located next to a glass exterior door and the windows next door are open. She stated when she called to complain about the noise two days prior, the officer

asked the neighbor to keep the windows closed while he plays the drums.

I explained to Mrs. Chernov I can suggest to the neighbor that they keep their windows closed and ask they not play the drums, there is nothing criminal about their behavior and therefore I can not enforce those suggestions. Mrs. Chernov explained the noise was very upsetting to her and asked I speak with the neighbor to be more considerate of their shared living situation.

I then went next door and spoke with the male playing the drums. He stated he is a musician and was practicing for an upcoming professional audition. He stated he only plays the drums for a two hour window and plays on the opposite side of the house from their shared wall. He seemed frustrated that the neighbor called about the drumming but stated he was finishing for the night.

At approximately 1830 hours (2021-015510), I was again dispatched for a noise complaint at 56 Hancock St. This time I spoke with Vladislav Chernov. He stated just prior to my arrival, there was loud music coming from the residence, however, now it stopped. He stated believed the resident was purposely trying to bother them with noise and he wished to make a report. He insisted that the resident needed to soundproof against the drumming being heard from their house. He stated he wished to make a report so he could take them to court over the noise. He then stated he called the police because he does not wish to speak to the neighbor and "lose his temper and do something". When I advised him that there is nothing I can enforce regarding the noise, he stated he would continue to call the police to speak with them. I asked if he was insinuating he would use the police as a way to bother the neighbor to which he stated yes. I advised Mr. Chernov that a report for today's complaint would be made and left the residence.

As I was getting to my patrol vehicle, the resident at 56 Hancock was on her front porch and asked to speak with me. The resident, Shanell West, asked about my presence at her residence earlier in the day. I explained that Mrs. Chernov called to complain about the noise from the drumming and I spoke with her son. I advised her that her son was very respectful and stated he was practicing for an upcoming audition, which I tried to explain to their neighbor. Ms. West stated her son only drums for two hours prior to 1600 hours during the week, and not on the weekends out of respect for the neighbors. She stated when Mrs. Chernov called the police earlier in the week, she made unreasonable requests of when her son should practice, however, they exchanged phone numbers to try to work out the issue. Ms. West was upset that rather than call her, Mrs. Chernov again called the police. Ms. West stated she is embarrassed to have police presence at her residence as a black family and stated her son has never had interaction with the police prior to the noise issue. She stated she felt Mr. and Mrs. Chernov were racist and were using the police to harass them.

I told Ms. West a report would be made regarding the complaints today and if the issue continues both parties have the right to sign complaints.

No further patrol action.
