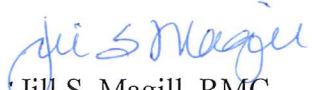

Upon approaching the vehicle, I observed a fresh pile of vomit on the ground outside of the front driver's side door. I observed the male operator, Brandon P Velez (), slumped over and he appeared to be sleeping. I made contact with him and observed several white pills in the center console and in a compartment near the steering wheel. While speaking with Velez, I detected an odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath as he spoke and noted that his eyes were bloodshot and watery. When Velez spoke, he did so slowly and his speech was slurred.

I requested Velez exit the vehicle to perform field sobriety tests and he complied. I led him to a level area clear of debris to perform the tests. Velez requested his glasses to perform field sobriety tests and same were retrieved from his vehicle.

I advised Velez how to complete the Walk and Turn Test and demonstrated same. Velez indicated that he understood how to perform the test. While in the starting position, Velez raised his arms greater than six inches from his sides to maintain his balance and he broke from the starting position twice and then stood with his feet side by side. When Velez began to start the test, he stumbled and indicated that he could not perform the test, stating, "Honestly, I don't think I can do it".

I advised Velez how to complete the One Leg Stand Test and demonstrated same. Velez indicated that he understood how to perform the test. While performing the test, Velez raised his arms greater than six inches from his sides to maintain his balance, and put his foot down after only approximately eighteen seconds.

I advised Velez how to complete the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus Test and he indicated that he understood how to perform the test. In each of his eyes, Velez displayed a lack of smooth pursuit of the stimulus, an onset of nystagmus prior to forty-five degrees, and a distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation.

Due to observing the aforementioned loose pills, a probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted. The pills were found to be unscheduled muscle relaxants and were later returned to Velez. A partially consumed bottle of alcoholic Krakken rum and a partially consumed jar of alcoholic moonshine were located in the front passenger's seat. No other items of interest were located.

I advised Velez that he was under arrest and secured him in the rear of a police vehicle without incident. I requested a towing company respond to impound the vehicle and Mario's Towing responded shortly thereafter and did so.

Velez was transported to police headquarters without incident. While removing Velez from the rear of my patrol vehicle, I detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the area in which he was seated that had not been present prior to seating Velez there. While walking Velez to the door to police headquarters, he was unsteady on his feet and his knees were sagging.

I secured Velez in the processing area and advised him of his Miranda Rights. Velez initialed and signed a West Deptford Police Department Miranda Rights form indicating same. Velez advised me that he had consumed several alcoholic Golden Monkey beers and unknown amounts of rum and moonshine while in the Riverwinds Community Center area. He indicated that he saw another vehicle in the area (Cpl. Loomis' patrol vehicle) and was going to leave the area. [REDACTED]

I read the New Jersey Attorney General's Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators pursuant to NJSA 39:4-50.2(e) and Velez responded, "yes".

I observed Velez for a period of no less than twenty minutes, during which time he did not burp, vomit, regurgitate, or otherwise perform any action that would have interfered with providing valid samples of his breath. I removed all electronic devices from both Velez and myself and escorted him to the DWI processing room. Velez was able to provide two valid breath samples on his first two attempts. I utilized a new mouthpiece for each sample. An Alcohol Influence Report Form printed and indicated that Velez had a reported breath test result of 0.09% BAC. An Alcotest calculator was used and confirmed the results as true. I escorted Velez back to the processing area [REDACTED]

NARRATIVE Alexander #4154 I conducted a MV stop on NJ Registration C50HJE due to the vehicle's rear tag light not working properly. It should be noted that Carney took longer than normal to pull the vehicle over, after I activated my emergency lights and siren, specifically by traveling several blocks before coming to a stop. It should be noted that from my training and experience, I know this to be a possible indicator of criminal activity. I then approached the driver, William Carney, and informed him of why he was stopped and gathered his information. It should be noted that after identifying Carney, I knew through previous knowledge, that he had an extensive criminal history for CDS related offenses. to provide me with a valid insurance card. During this time, I was also able to identify the passenger, as Tara Charlton.

While speaking to Carney and Charlton, they provided me with conflicting stories about where they were coming from and where they were going. Carney originally stated that they were headed to Charlton's house, but then Charlton interjected and stated that they were actually just coming from the Quality Inn in Gloucester City, but were going to her house in Pitman. Then they changed their story again and stated that they were going to Carney's house. It should be noted that while speaking to them, I observed two small rubber bands right next to Charlton's leg, and from my training and experience I am aware that these bands are commonly used for the "bundling" of multiple bags of heroin.

I then returned to my vehicle and was advised by Patrolman McWain that she was showing at least one active traffic warrant out of Camden. It was later confirmed that Charlton had multiple active warrants out of Camden City totaling \$3750 (\$750 Warrant #S2015005577, \$1000 Warrant #SC2015002252, \$1000 Warrant #SC2015002251, \$1000 CC30181). I then returned to the vehicle and placed Charlton under arrest after informing her that she had an active warrant. It should be noted that while placing Charlton under arrest, Carney appeared visibly nervous by having to keep leaning over in the vehicle to see what was going.

Due to having a prior knowledge of Carney's criminal history involving multiple CDS related offenses, Carney taking longer than normal to pull the vehicle over, getting conflicting stories about where they were coming from and going, and observing drug paraphernalia in the vehicle, I advised Carney that I was going to be conducting a probable cause search of the vehicle. After advising Carney that I was going to be conducting a search, he kept moving around and did not exit the vehicle immediately after I told him to. I then came over to the driver's side of the vehicle to have him step out and he climbed over the passenger's seat and exited out the passenger's side. After he stepped out of the vehicle I advised him of his legal responsibility to surrender any CDS. Carney replied that he did not have any CDS on him or in the vehicle.

A search of the vehicle was then conducted, and a blue heat sealed bag containing a rock like substance suspected to be cocaine was found under the driver's side seat. I then placed Carney under arrest and walked him over to Patrolman McWain's patrol vehicle. While placing Carney in the patrol vehicle Carney kept adjusting his pants. I then observed a bag fall out of his pants and onto the ground. I then inspected the bag and found that it contained thirteen various containers, containing a rock like substance suspected to be cocaine, and three zip lock bags, each containing a wax fold with a powder substance suspected to be heroin.

A further search of Carney's vehicle was then conducted and a glass pipe that was packed with metal mesh, and was burnt on both ends, was found on the front driver's seat of the vehicle. It should be noted that from my training and experience this type of pipe is commonly used for smoking "crack" cocaine.

Patrolman McWain then transported Carney back to the station and I transported Charlton. It should be noted that upon arriving at the station Carney voluntarily admitted he was the owner of all the contraband in the vehicle after being advised of his Miranda rights. Carney was then processed and later released after being issued the below traffic and criminal summonses. He was also given a copy of the Central Judicial Processing Form (Attached). Charlton was later remanded to Camden County Jail after being unable to post on the Camden warrants.

The suspected heroin was submitted into evidence after being placed in a plastic bag marked 17-280, JPA #3, 1-4-17, #4154.

were operable. I then went to the passenger's side so that I could speak with the driver.

The driver identified herself as [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]).

While I was attempting to speak with [REDACTED], the front seat passenger (later identified as Michael T Abbott ([REDACTED])) kept interrupting me. I then performed a motor vehicle stop on the vehicle and made contact with the occupants. The operator identified himself as Kevin M Howell ([REDACTED]) and the front seat passenger identified himself as Brian A Hoskins (3/18/83). I advised Howell of the reason for the stop and he indicated that he was on his way to an auto parts store in Gibbstown.

I returned to my patrol car and requested dispatch check both for warrants. A short time later, dispatch advised that Hoskins was wanted on multiple active warrants for his arrest. I returned to Howell's vehicle, advised Hoskins of the warrants, and placed him into custody without incident. I seated him in the rear of my patrol car.

Through my training and experience, I knew that the use of narcotic analgesics will constrict pupils and that puncture wounds over veins often indicated intravenous drug use.

I returned to speak with Howell and requested he exit the vehicle. Howell complied and I confronted him with the fact that he and Hoskins were providing me with a different account of events. Howell confirmed that they had not stopped anywhere and seemed confused as to why Hoskins had told me they had been in Camden, NJ. Howell indicated that he had never been arrested for a drug offense, but that Hoskins was a drug user. While speaking with Howell, I noted that he stuttered as he spoke, I observed puncture wounds over veins located in his hands, and I observed his pupils

A closer inspection of the contents revealed one pack of (11) wax folds containing suspected heroin, one pack of (14) wax folds containing suspected heroin, and (1) glassine bag containing suspected cocaine. I secured these items and returned to speak with Hoskins.

I verbally advised Hoskins of his Miranda Rights and he indicated that he understood same. I advised Hoskins that I had located the aforementioned items in the vehicle and he denied ownership of same.

I verbally advised Howell of his Miranda Rights and he indicated that he understood same. I advised Howell that I had located the aforementioned items in the vehicle and he denied ownership of same. Howell was placed into custody and seated in the rear of a patrol car. Both were transported to police headquarters without incident.

At headquarters, Hoskins advised me that the contraband I had seized belonged to him but acknowledged that Howell was aware that it was in the vehicle. He advised that he had purchased the seized contraband in Camden, NJ and was planning on giving "a few bags" to Howell as payment for the transportation.
