NARRATIVE

On Thursday, 08/19/2021 I responded to Piscataway Department of Public Works to speak to the Office of Emergency Management Coordinator Paul Snyder regarding an incident with River Road Volunteer Rescue Squad Chief Evan Shegoski.

Mr. Snyder advised me that after a meeting on July 12th, 2021 regarding the Township fireworks that are set to be displayed on September 5, 2021, he reached out to Evan requesting River Road Rescue Squads presence at the fireworks. Evan replied to him that he does not believe that River Road Rescue Squad will be attending that event because it is not their duty to solely cover events and pick up the scraps. Evan was of the opinion that the town should hire paid EMS services for the event. Mr. Snyder advised him that he will simply ask surrounding towns for help, and Evan responded that he wished him luck because all agencies around the state are aware of the fact that the Township is hiring paid EMS services as the full time township providers. Mr. Snyder then advised Evan that he would call his daughter, who is with the Fanwood Volunteer Rescue Squad, as they have worked at the Townships fireworks display in the past. Evan responded that he would reach out to her to tell her not to do it.

Mr. Snyder said that within five minutes of ending the phone conversation with Evan, his daughter Melissa Padulsky reached out to him inquiring what was going on because Evan had reached out to her.

I spoke to Melissa on the phone. She stated that out of nowhere she received a text message from Evan asking that her rescue squad not participate in the upcoming event. Melissa stated that she replied to him to confirm that he meant the fireworks, and he mentioned that he wanted the town to be forced to pay for EMS services for the event. Melissa stated that there was some back and forth texts but then Evan started to become confrontational towards her so she ceased communication. He has not contacted her since.

I advised both Mr. Snyder and Melissa to contact this agency in the event that communication from Evan starts to become harassing in nature. Melissa emailed me screen shots of the conversation.
