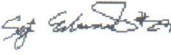

78. Narrative
On 10/02/2024 the undersigned was dispatched to 343 Magnolia Ave for the report of a male that had just exited that residence which is a vacant property. The caller was an adjacent neighbor. The male was described as a brown skin male wearing a grey hooded sweatshirt and black shorts. The description provided is consistent with that of Isaiah Lawrence. I am familiar with Lawrence from numerous prior police contact. Lawrence is known to frequently burglarize local businesses, residences and vehicles in the area. Also, I was aware that there was an outstanding active warrant for the arrest of Lawrence for a burglary that occurred on 09/28/2024 in Berlin Twp. (See case #2024013165) The following is my recollection of the incident that occurred. Further details can be found on my department issued body worn camera.

Upon my arrival I met with the caller who advised me he observed the male exit the residence and head down Magnolia Ave. on foot. The description and direction of travel was provided to assisting units. The caller advised that he works nights and that this is the third or fourth time he has observed this male leaving the vacant residence. Patrolman Garrison and I checked the exterior of the residence. An unsecured front door was discovered. There was no forced entry. Assisting officers began to arrive on scene and in the area. Patrolman Garrison and I made entry into the residence through the unsecured front door. As we were clearing the vacant residence, I observed recent and fresh sign indicating that someone had been occupying the residence. There were numerous cigarette butts, a soda bottle, multi-colored neck gaiter/face mask and a cellular phone charger that was plugged into an outlet. Let it be known that Lawrence is known to possess a cellular phone which on numerous occasions he has been found to be utilizing electrical outlets of businesses and residences to charge it using a similar charger. Once the residence was cleared a K9 was called to the scene to attempt a track of the suspect. Voorhees K9 34K4 responded to the scene. Patrolman Garrison assisted 34K4 with the track. See Voorhees case #2024-32086. Lieutenant Childs was on scene

and had obtained permission from the owner of the property to process the scene and collect evidence. See Lieutenant Childs supplemental report. While remaining in the area and circulating the surrounding neighborhood for Lawrence it was reported by Lieutenant Childs who was still at 343 Magnolia that he observed Lawrence in an adjacent yard. It was relayed via radio that Lawrence had fled on foot and a brief foot chase ensued. While continuing to search the area Lieutenant Fitzgibbon observed Lawrence running on foot in the area of Division and Larch Ave. Lieutenant FitzGibbon pursued Lawrence on foot. I was also in this area and had observed Lawrence on foot running west across Larch ave. into the yard of 320 Larch Ave. He was wearing black shorts and a grey hooded sweatshirt. While keeping him in sight, providing his direction via radio and yelling for Lawrence to stop I pursued Lawrence on foot continuing west through several yards. We crossed Myrtle Ave and headed back towards Magnolia Ave. As I continued running through several properties, I was able to observe Lawrence slow down as he had entered the rear yard of 339 Magnolia Ave. Due to overgrown brush, I fell during the pursuit however maintained a constant visual of Lawrence and recovered quickly continuing to pursue Lawrence. Lawrence had run to the area where Lieutenant Childs was positioned. I continued the foot pursuit and as I approached Lt Childs was giving loud and clear verbal commands to Lawrence. As I approached, Lawrence was on the ground in the prone position. I handcuffed Lawrence and immediately stood him up. I advised Lawrence that he was under arrest for breaking and entering. EMS was called due to Lawrence having minor abrasions. The abrasions that Lawrence sustained on his feet were self-inflicted due to him running barefoot throughout the foot pursuit. Patrolman Garrison searched Lawrence and placed him into the rear of his marked patrol car and transported him to Berlin Twp police headquarters without incident. Lawrence was searched and placed into cell #1. His property was inventoried and documented. During the inventory several credit cards not belonging to Lawrence were discovered. These were collected and placed into Berlin Twp police evidence. A separate investigation into these cards will be conducted under this case number at a later date. During this process Lawrence was argumentative and passive aggressive with officers. He would initially ignore officers' commands or fail to acknowledge the clear and concise directions he was being given. EMS responded to Berlin Twp police headquarters. Lawrence refused to be treated or seen by EMS. During processing Lawrence continued to act belligerent and passive aggressive towards officers. Lawrence was processed and charged with Burglary 2C:18-2A(2), Criminal trespass 2C:18-3, Obstruction 2C:29-1A and resisting arrest 2C:29-2A(2) on warrant # 0406 W 2024 000180. Lawrence was also processed on active warrant # 0406 W 2024 000179 and the fingerprints were linked successfully. Throughout the process and interaction Lawrence continued his belligerent behavior towards police. Lawrence was transported by Patrolman Garrison to Camden County Correctional facility where correctional staff took custody of him. The property of Lawrence which was inventoried was turned over to Camden County Correctional facility. Case closed pending court.

51. Narrative
This report is a summary of my recollection of events, more detailed information may be found on my body worn camera.

On 10/2/2024 at 1133 hours Berlin Township Police officers were dispatched for a breaking and entering in progress at 343 Magnolia Ave West Berlin NJ 08091. I, Det. Lt. Childs, responded to assist patrol officers. Central communications advised that caller was a neighbor and had seen a black male in a grey hooded sweatshirt and black pants exit the residence. It should be noted that on 09/28/2024 there was a burglary to Hero Outfitters (case #202413165). The suspect in this case is Isaiah Lawrence. Mr. Lawrence is very well known to this department and is a habitual offender, specifically for burglary. The caller's description matched Mr. Lawrence's description and the clothing that he was last seen in during the burglary at Hero Outfitters. Based on the evidence in the case of the burglary to Hero Outfitters, Mr. Lawrence was charged for burglary and had an outstanding warrant for his arrest.

Upon arrival Ptlm. Garrison and Sgt. Edwards located and unsecure front door. I then positioned myself in the rear

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of the property to hold the rear perimeter. Officers cleared the residence and did not locate anyone inside the residence. Sgt. Edwards advised me that there is evidence of someone squatting in the residence, specifically a phone charger, burnt cigarette butts, and food items. I requested central communications to check the surrounding towns for a K9 to conduct a track. Ptlm. Campbell and his K9 partner Denver arrived on location a short time late. Ptlm. Garrison then assisted Ptlm. Campbell with the track. Sgt. Edwards circulated the area in his patrol vehicle. I stood by at the scene of the burglary and began to photograph the scene. It should be noted that this property is currently for sale and is vacant. I contacted the relator via my department issued cell phone, Deysi Nunez, and advised her of the circumstances. I requested consent to collect evidence within the residence. Ms. Nunez advised me that the residence is currently under contract and she would contact the buyer of the residence.

While I was on the phone with Ms. Nunez I observed a shadow in the rear of the property through the wooden fence. I then observed a male begin to pull himself over the fence. The male looked directly at me and I immediately recognized him as Isaiah Lawrence. Mr. Lawrence observed me, in my full departmental uniform and outer vest clearly identifying me as a police officer, and pushed himself over the fence and fled on foot onto Myrtle Ave which is directly behind Magnolia Ave. I immediately notified assisting units and a perimeter was established. I was unable to give chase as I still had my department issued camera with me. I secured the camera in my patrol vehicle and stood by at the residence to secure the crime scene. Officers continued to circulate the area in an attempt to locate Mr. Lawrence. A short time later, Lt. FitzGibbon of this department was in the area and advised he observed Mr. Lawrence running back towards the property where I was.

At this time I had positioned myself in the area where I believed Mr. Lawrence was going to appear. I then observed Mr. Lawrence exit from the rear of the backyard of 339 Magnolia. I gave clear commands of "stop" and "police" to Mr. Lawrence. Still, Mr. Lawrence attempted to evade custody by running in the opposite direction of me. Mr. Lawrence then stopped and began to go to sit. As Mr. Lawrence began to sit I observed his hands go directly towards his waist band. I immediately was fearful for my safety and for the safety of other officers due to Mr. Lawrence reaching towards his waist band. Based on my training and experience suspects often conceal weapons in their waistband. Fearing that Mr. Lawrence may be armed with a weapon I unholstered my department issued firearm and pointed it at Mr. Lawrence giving clear commands to show me his hands. Mr. Lawrence complied and was taken into custody without issue. Mr. Lawrence had an abrasion to his foot and was barefoot. It is unknown when Mr. Lawrence suffered his foot injury. EMS was dispatched and Mr. Lawrence refused treatment at headquarters.

Mr. Lawrence was transported to BTPD HQ where he was charged accordingly and processed for the charges from this dates burglary and the outstanding warrant from the burglary at Hero Outfitters. For further information and details into this burglary see Sgt. Edwards investigation report.

After Mr. Lawrence was cleared from the scene I spoke with the realtor, Ms. Nunez, again. Ms. Nunez put me into contact with the buyer, Max Diaz, via telephone. Both Ms. Nunez and Mr. Diaz were briefed on the circumstances surrounding the investigation thus far. I requested consent from Mr. Diaz to process the scene which he verbally granted over the phone which was captured on my body worn camera.

Utilizing my department issued digital camera a cannon EOS 3000D I then photographed the scene. There was no signs of forced entry on the door that entered the residence into the kitchen. Inside the kitchen was a "Fanta" brand soda bottle that was filled with a clear liquid that was eventually drained and emptied. Also inside the kitchen was some type of food item with burnt cigarette butts inside the item. There was also 8 loose white cigarettes on the floor in the kitchen.

Located inside one of the bathrooms was a cell phone charger with a purple cord that was plugged into the outlet in the bathroom. It should be noted that this charger fit the cell phone that Mr. Lawrence had in his possession at the time of his arrest. At HQ the charger was placed into the phone to show that it fit and was photographed. Also, inside this bathroom hanging from the toilet paper hanger was an article of clothing. Upon further inspection of this article of clothing it was a multi-colored neck gator/ face mask. Mr. Lawrence was seen wearing this face mask during the burglary to Hero Outfitters and prior to when he was caught on a trail camera in the area of Hero Outfitters.

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I continued to photograph the rest of the residence. Inside the toilet of one of the bathrooms were two burnt cigarette butts. These were not collected due to them being in water. I continued to photograph the rest of the residence not finding any items of evidentiary value.

After completing the photographs, I then began collecting the evidence. Utilizing latex gloves, I retrieved the listed items above and placed them in separate brown evidence bags. The unknown food items that are photographed were not collected at the scene.

Upon further inspection of the window in the kitchen it was observed that the screen was slightly lifted. I believed that this was Mr. Lawrence's point of entry to the residence. Upon further inspection of the window two potential fingerprints were located on the outside of the window. Utilizing my department issued fingerprint kit I lifted two prints from the window. These prints were then transported and stored in evidence. The prints will be transported to the sheriffs department ID unit for further analysis.

The plastic bottle, 8 loose cigarettes, 1 multi-colored neck gator/ face mask, and 3 burnt cigarette butts were entered into LIMS and awaiting approval for DNA testing from the NJSP forensic lab. The cell phone charger was submitted into evidence and fingerprints will attempted to be lifted from them at a later date.

It should be noted that on the department issued camera the date and time stamp in the camera system is not accurate. Mr. Lawrence's cell phone was given back to him during processing.

On 10/03/2024 I received approval from the NJSP forensic lab for DNA testing for the plastic bottle and 3 burnt cigarette butts. The neck gator and 8 loose cigarettes were stored in BTPD property and can be resubmitted for testing at a later date. On 10/04/2024 I transported the plastic bottle and cigarette butts to the NJSP forensic lab for testing. A supplemental report will be generated upon receiving the results for the DNA testing.

It should be noted that my BWC was reviewed prior to submission of this report.

51. Narrative

On 10/02/2024 the undersigned along with assisting officers apprehended and arrested Isaiah Lawrence for burglary as well as additional crimes. During the course of this investigation and search incident to arrest of Lawrence it was discovered that he was in possession of 3 credit/bank cards that were not in his name. Lawrence being in possession of these cards that did not belong to him is a consistent result of his modus operandi of burglarizing vehicles and residences of property. The cards were located in his wallet. The cards discovered were a Wawa credit card and Venmo card belonging to T. Santone, a Discover card belonging to M. Rees and a Bank of America card belonging to S. Lau. The cards were confiscated and stored in Berlin twp. police evidence.

On 10/03/2024 a wallet was discovered by a utility worker and turned over to a Berlin Twp officer working a nearby construction detail. That officer returned the wallet to the owner (T. Santone) at her residence. Santone advised that she did not wish to pursue any criminal complaints and that the missing cards had already been cancelled.

I followed up via telephone on 10/03/2024 with S. Lau in regard to his card. He advised he had already filed a report for the missing card with Gibbsboro police on 09/04/2024 (report #2024-05747) Lau did not wish to pursue criminal complaints and had already cancelled the card. It was unknown where his property was stolen from. Lau did not want his card back.

I followed up via telephone on 10/03/2024 with M. Rees in regard to her card. Rees did not wish to pursue criminal complaints and had already cancelled the card. She did not want her card back.

No further report.
