11. Assist in activities relative to employer-employee labor relations with prime responsibility for pertinent data and information.
12. Serve on Administrative and Superintendent's Councils.
13. Attend Board public meetings.
14. Shall submit monthly reports of his activities to the Superintendent.
15. Director of all activities of Camp Beadleston.
16. Carry out other assignments as directed by the Superintendent.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BRICK IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY, ON TUESDAY, DECEMBER 23, 1969

NOTICE IS HERBY given to the legal voters of the School District of the Township of Brick, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey, that a Special Election of the legal voters of said District will be held on TUESDAY, the 23rd day of DECEMBER, 1969, at 2:00 P.M.

The polls will remain open until 9:00 P.M., and as much longer as may be necessary to permit all the legal voters then present to vote and to cast their ballots. The election will be held and all the legal voters of the school District will vote at the respective polling places stated below.

At the said election, the following I be submitted:

PROPOSAL NO. 1

The Board of Education of the Township of Brick, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey, hereby

westerly 1283 feet more or less along the northeasterly line of the aforesaid Lot 3 to the easterly line of Lot 21, in Block 548 as shown on the aforesaid tax map. Being a strip of land 33 feet in width lying along the northeasterly line of Lot 3, the southerly line of which is described above. (33 feet right of way along the northeasterly line of Lot 3, Block 548.)

B. Lots 3, 4 and 5, Block 1108, as indicated on the Tax Map of the Township of Brick at page 59.

C. Lots 5, 6 and 7, Block 902, as indicated on the Tax Map of the Township of Brick, at page 50; and to expend therefor, including incidental expenses, not exceeding \$500,000.00; and (a) to issue bonds of the School District for said purposes in the principal amount of \$300,000.00 thus using up \$2,513,050.97 of the \$6,326,821.58 borrowing margin of the Township of Brick previously available for other improvements and (b) the transfer of \$200,000.00 from the Current Expense Account to the Capital Outlay Account.

1. PINE STREET, BRICK TOWNSHIP, N.J.

Beginning at a point in the center line of Pine Street distant 150 feet westerly from the westerly line of Brentwood Avenue thence westerly 350 feet more or less along the center line of Pine Street to a point in the easterly line of Holly Avenue as shown on the Brick Township Tax Map. Being a right of way 40 feet in width the center line of which is described above.

2. CHESTNUT STREET, BRICK TOWNSHIP, OCEAN COUNTY, N.J.

Beginning in the westerly line of Brentwood Avenue where the same is intersected by the center line of Chestnut Street; thence northwesterly 591 feet more or less along the center line of Chestnut Street, crossing Holly Avenue to the easterly line of Block 712 as shown on the Brick Township Tax Map. Being a right of way 40 feet in width the center line of which is described above.

3. GARDEN STREET, BRICK TOWNSHIP, OCEAN COUNTY, N.J.
