The Brick Township Board of Education held a meeting with the Brick Township Association of School Administrators at 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 17, 1981 in the Administration Building, 101 Hendrickson Avenue.

Present were: Mr. Hancock, Mr. Bell, Mr. Bertrand, Mr. Donofrio, Mrs. Fox (8:10 p.m.), Mr. Bittmann, and Mr. Williams.

Also present: Mr. Stutts, Mr. Sendzik, and Dr. Aragona (8:22 p.m.)

Mr. Stutts announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows on September 14, 1981: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk, and Brick Town News.

Mr. Hancock opened this meeting noting that this is a work session called by request of the Brick Township Association of School Administrators. He noted for the audience that Mr. Crescenzo is present this evening with many of the School Administrators of the district.

Mr. John Crescenzo, Chairman, introduced the other members of the executive board, namely, Mr. Lynch, Mr. Handschuch, Mr. Zink, Mr. Boyle, Mr. Brooks, Mrs. Cunningham, and Mr. Raymond Benedict.

Mr. Crescenzo read a statement representing the views of their organization with regard to recent administrative reassignments. After Mr. Crescenzo had completed reading his prepared statement to the members of the Board of Education, Mr. Hancock thanked Mr. Crescenzo and his association for expressing their concerns, and stated that some concerns were well taken. He asked that Mr. Crescenzo make available a copy of his statement for distribution to the members of the Board of Education. He also said he appreciated the continued dedication of our administrators. (Mr. Crescenzo's statement was copied and distributed to board members under separate cover.)

Each board member made comments on said statement. Mr. Bell said there were some things he agreed with, and others he took exception to. Mrs. Fox noted that she made decisions, after a lot of deliberation, on how she felt was fairest to all.

Mr. Bittmann also noted that his decisions were difficult ones being he is a comparatively new board member, and did not really know some of the administrators involved.

Mr. Williams and Mr. Bertrand also commented on Mr. Crescenzo's statement and its concerns.

Mr. Hancock asked that it be clearly understood by all that the transfers are done and in effect; there will be no change. The Brick Township Board of Education held their Pre-Agenda Meeting on Monday, October 5, 1981 at 7:30 p.m. in the Administration Building.

Present were: Mr. Hancock, Mr. Bell (7:40 p.m.), Mr. Bittmann, Mr. Donofrio, Mrs. Fox (7:45 p.m.) Mr. Bertrand, and Mr. Williams.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton, Mr. Sendzik, and Mr. Murphy.

#### Sunshine Law

Mr. Stutts announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News on September 30, 1981.

#### Buildings & Grounds

Mr. Stutts presented items under Building and Grounds and answered questions from board members. The installation of lights at Memorial High School Football Field was discussed at length and many avenues of thought explored as to timing for such installation, bidding of same, and possible completion time schedule. It was agreed to include this item on the Action Agenda for October 14th and noted that the actual installation will probably be in the Spring of 1982.

The proposal to rewire Herbertsville School was also reviewed and direction given to also include this item on the Action Agenda.

An item referring to renovation of heating controls at Brick Township High School was directed to be held for further study.

An item referring to the condition of fields throughout the district was for informational purposes only. Mr. Hancock recommended that a Committee be formed with the Building and Grounds Committee members, headed by Mr. Williams, and involving Mr. Stutts, Mr. Alexy, Mr. Rao, Mr. Handchen, Mr. Wolf, a Township Council member, Mr. Donofrio, Mr. Bittmann, and Mrs. Hibberd to come up with a comprehensive two or three year plan to fix up our fields.

Mr. Stutts was directed to secure bids for the items on work to be done on the heating boilers at the High School East, Midstreams School, and Drum Point Road School and also to contact Mr. Cramer to give us a fee schedule for services, and to put this item on a future agenda.

Mr. Stutts discussed the need for fencing at Memorial High School near the retention pond. The subject was reviewed and Mr. Bertrand advised that he would have more explicit information after his meeting on Wednesday, October 7th. The erection of snow fencing was discussed as a possible temporary solution.

Items under Curriculum and Instruction were discussed and direction given to include on the Action Agenda.

Mr. Murphy presented a program on the Basic Skills Improvement Project. The Board thanked him for an extremely informative presentation.

Dr. Aragona brought up the subject of S.A.T. scores and the need to add a course, possibly to be held right after school, and to be free of charge, to help students become more knowledgeable in the areas stressed by the S.A.T. testing. He felt that the minimum expenditure would be about \$4,000. a year. A question was asked about the existing Adult School course and those students who have already paid for said course, and it was agreeable that those Brick Township students, if any, should be reimbursed from the Adult School.

The items under Finance and Business including Vouchers and Bids were reviewed and approved for the Action Agenda. Mr. Stutts notified the board members that additional bid items would be included.

The item referring to High School Graduation Policy was approved to also be included on the Action Agenda.

Items under Auxiliary were reviewed and approved as stated.

It was agreed by all that the Regular Meeting in November would be scheduled for Tuesday, November 10th due to the school holidays on November 11, 12 and 13.

At 9:10 p.m. Mr. Stutts read a motion to go into executive session for the reason of discussing items under Personnel and matters involving pending litigation and Memorial High School.

An item under Building and Grounds referred to insurance and pending litigation was the first item discussed. It was felt that possible misrepresentations had been made by our insurance agent with regard to liability coverages for board members involved in the suit with Carney. Mr. Cardamone's statement at a public meeting that "no matter what happens you are covered" was referred to and Mr. Anton said they would locate said statement on tapes. Mr. Anton felt, in his opinion, that coverage is there and he expected to contact our insurance agent.

Mr. Anton gave a capsule presentation on the events to date to do with the present pending litigation concerning Brick Township Memorial High School. He commended Mr. Williams on his untiring efforts to unfold many areas concerned in this matters. He stated that our law suit will survive or disintegrate on the reports submitted by the professionals we employ to check out all these areas we contend are in violation of our contract for the work to be done and quality of same at Memorial High School.

He referred to informational material he had received at his office, a service he felt might be of great assistance to this Board of Education in their efforts to prove deficiencies. All board members were in agreement, by consensus vote that Mr. Anton was to contact this company and set up a date for the entire board to meet with them. It was suggested that references should be requested in order that board members could be assured that the service is good.

It was agreed when all things were done, this would be done at a public meeting, duly advertised. It was also agreed that Mr. Anton should request a final billing from Mr. Wolk, of Birdsall Corporation, before we attend the settlement conference proposed by Mr. Carney's attorney.

Mr. Hancock stated that he has reviewed every bit of this matter that Mr. Anton presented tonight, and agreed that there are serious problems. He continued to say that apparently all were in agreement that we put this in to the hands of the total board and attorney. He said he had a simple motion before him that he wanted to read, and asked if anyone wished to amend it, discuss it, or whatever, we would do so accordingly.

Mr. Anton stated he felt the matter a simple one, to merely return the matter to the Board in all terms and aspects. Mr. Hancock agreed and read the following: "Move that all matters pertaining to the Brick Township Memorial High School in general and the pending litigation between Thomas P. Carney, Inc. in particular, in any form, shall henceforth come within the jurisdiction of the entire Board and the Buildings and Grounds Committee is discharged concerning the same."

Mr. Anton questioned putting this on the agenda in that form as it might be thought by some as a reflection on the Building and Grounds Committee. He was directed to prepare a resolution and touch up the language (as previously noted) between now and Action Agenda time.

Mr. Bittmann asked a question about the distribution of agendas to the public at pre-agenda meeting; however, Mr. Anton was putting his material together into his brief case and did not have a chance to stop Mr. Bittmann's question which was not proper in accordance with the Sunshine Law.

Mr. Anton referred to the "settlement conference" scheduled to discuss possible settlement of the litigation and stated he felt that some representation of Board and Administration should be present. It was agreed that either Dr. Aragona or Mr. Wolf should represent Administration, and either, or both, Mr. Hancock and Mr. Bell for the Board. Mr. Williams expressed a desire to attend but agreed that it probably would not be in his best interests.

At 10:55 p.m. motion was made by Mr. Bell, seconded by Mrs. Fox and carried unanimously to adjourn this meeting.
