The Brick Township Board of Education held a Pre-Agenda Meeting at 7:50 p.m. on Monday, November 30, 1981 in the Administration Building, 101 Hendrickson Avenue for the purpose of discussing items presented to them for review for the Action Agenda on December 9th Regular Public Meeting.

Present were: Mr. Hancock, Mr. Bell, Mr. Bertrand, Mr. Bittmann, Mr. Donofrio, Mrs. Fox, and Mr. Williams.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton, Mr. Mayer, and Mr. Brouillette.

Mr. Stutts announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk, and Brick Town News on November 24, 1981.

Pre-Agenda

Mr. Hancock presented the pre-agenda items, page by page. Minutes were agreed to, items under Curriculum and Instruction were reviewed and direction given. Mr. Hancock asked that the Administration prepare a presentation on starting an Adult School.

Mr. Brouillette was present at this time to give some additional information and cost figures to the board members on the proposed Air Force Junior ROTC Program for the Brick Township School District. It was directed that this be included on the Action Agenda on December 9, 1981 for formal approval pending approval notification from the Air Force. Mr. Brouillette was asked if he could again present his program on December 9th.

Items under Finance and Business were also reviewed and at this time Mr. Huss was present to present the synopsis of the 1981 Audit for use in accordance with R.S. 18A:23-4. Mr. Stutts advised that he will make his required responses to same.

Budget
Preparation

Preparation of the proposed 1982-83 School Budget was brought to the floor for discussion by Mr. Hancock. Many avenues of thought were discussed and explored as to the format that might be followed to expedite completion of same. Recommendations included getting a figure of monies used until December 31, 1981 in the various accounts to use as a guideline for the 1982-83 budget, adding any new items which may have recommended. The CAP was referred to and it was agreed that it is the aim of this Board of Education to keep well below same.

Further recommendations were to get community input as to their concerns on the needs of the various schools in our district. Mr. Bell felt it might be advantageous to the passage of the budget at referendum time if someone would sit down with the residents of Greenbriar and explain the needs of the district, and the amounts in said Budget which are fixed items, such as salaries, insurances, etc.

Budget meetings will be set and Mr. Anton was questioned on requirement of a quorum for same. Dr. Aragona was asked to communicate with the P.T.A. Organizations to get their outlooks on school needs.

Items under Teaching Personnel were reviewed and agreed to. Discussion was held on an item relating to a half time Nurse at Osbornville School. It was agreed that there are two schools nearby, Drum Point and Emma Havens, with adequate coverage, and that Osbornville School has never had a problem with the parttime nurse in that building.

Items under Non-Teaching Personnel were also reviewed and approval given to include same on the Action Agenda. After discussing the employment of Security Guards, the fire alarm systems in the school were referred to. Mr. Stutts is to get cost figures to connect the systems in the various schools, and was asked to check out why the alarm system at Memorial High School was not in operation.

The item under Policy was agreed to, and discussion followed on the items under Auxiliary. Mr. Stutts presented another item on placement of 4 out-of-district students, and approval was given to include same on the Action Agenda.

Correspondence from Mr. Bittmann with regard to a Student Board Member was discussed at great length. Many many thoughts were expressed including what criterion would be use for the selection of a student to sit in as a board members (with certain limitations) at board meetings. It was finally agreed by a majority consensus vote that the Superintendent come up with an Administrative recommendation and that same be placed on the agenda for the next work session. Mr. Bertrand stated that he would like Dr. Aragona to contact other School Superintendents and get letters from them spelling out their experiences with this concept.

At 9:50 p.m. motion was made by Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Donofrio and carried unanimously to adjourn this meeting.
