

January 14, 1981
Brick Town, New Jersey

The Brick Township Board of Education held a Work Session at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 14, 1981 in the Administration Building to discuss land sites for a new elementary school and/or additions to existing school buildings. Following this session, at 7:57 p.m. the Board of Education held their Regular Monthly Meeting.

Present were: Mr. Bell, Mr. Donofrio, Mrs. Frake, Mr. Schue
and Mrs. Fox. (Mr. Hancock requested that he be excused
via telephone message to Administration)
Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Stutts and Mr. Sendzik.

Mrs. Fox announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be posted by having the date, time and place thereof posted as follows:
Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News on January 9, 1981.

Mrs. Fox then read a resolution to go into executive session for the reason that the discussion would involve purchase of land by acquisition of real property with public funds and that if the discussion were an open one, the asking price of suggested property could be increased. Mr. Bell made a motion to approve Mrs. Fox's resolution which was seconded by Mr. Donofrio and carried unanimously.

Mr. Bell presented the board members with details of property visited by Mr. Bertrand and other members as well as members of the Administration. Mrs. Frake also referred to properties she had visited and recommended. After a lengthy discussion of lands and various recommendations, agreement was reached on a particular acreage and Mr. Sendzik was directed to prepare motions for the Action Agenda to follow in this regard. Employment of Mr. Gatarz to do site work necessary to prepare this proposal for the Planning Board, State Department and the County Superintendent and all other agencies necessary was also agreed to.

Mr. Bertrand and Mrs. Frake were authorized to negotiate on behalf of the board with regard to discussed property. The Attorney was authorized to make necessary title searches and proceed with legal preparations for the purchase of land, if agreed to. It was also noted that purchase of land commitments should include "pending passing of referendum".

It was the consensus of opinion 4-1 (Mr. Schue-no) that this referendum should be for a 600 pupil school.

At 7:57 p.m. Mrs. Fox reopened the Public Meeting and again read the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law.
