Session

Mrs. Frake then make a motion, seconded by Mr. Schue and carried unanimously to approve a resolution read by Mrs. Fox explaining the need to go into closed session.

WHEREAS, C. 231, P.L. 1975 also known as the Sunshine Law authorizes a public body to meet in executive or private session under certain limited circumstances; and

Whereas, said law requires the Board to adopt a resolution at a public meeting before it can meet in such an executive or private session:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BRICK SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. That it does hereby determine that it is necessary to meet in executive session this date to discuss matters involving the acquisition of land and/or selection of site for proposed new elementary school and/or additions.
2. That the matter discussed will be made public if and when confidentiality is no longer required and action pursuant to said discussion shall take place only at a public meeting.

As the discussion was restricted to a particular selection of property, our Attornies directed that the portion of the meeing in closed session not be recorded on tape.

After this particular piece of property was discussed, and reasons accepted for it not being suitable for a school building, it was agreed that because of a time element and the close proximity of the March 14th scheduled Special Election, (necessary State Department forms to be filed, etc.) that

the Lake Riviera Middle School site would be the location placed on ballot for the proposed school.

This session was closed at 7:40 p.m. by resolution of Mr. Hancock, second by Mrs. Frake, and unanimous agreement. However, because the notice had stated that the closed session would be from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., after which public portion would begin, there was a recess called until 8:30 p.m.

At 8:30 p.m. Mrs. Fox again read the Sunshine Law, and took roll call with the same members attending this meeting.

A discussion followed with regard to the question to be placed on the March 14, 1981 Special School Election ballot. Mrs. Fox explained that the closed session was held to discuss the site for the school building and that it had been found that the previously selected site was found not suitable for school needs.

She then read two letters Mr. Zach, Ocean County Superintendent of Schools, had written to Dr. Aragona with regard to our proposed school building program and the district needs.

Mrs. Fox discussed the many suggested solutions to our district needs including a 600 pupil school and a Cafeteria at Veterans Middle School (a two part proposal on the ballot), a one question proposal calling for a 600 pupil school with a Cafeteria at Veterans Middle, a 600 pupil school, or a 1050 pupil school.

A consensus vote was taken on each suggestion and the proposal to erect a 600 pupil school on the Lake Riviera Middle School site was the only one receiving the proper number of the majority of the board votes.

At 9:30 p.m. motion was made by Mr. Donofrio, seconded by Mr. Schue and carried unanimously to adjourn this meeting.
