Motion was made by Mrs. Fox, seconded by Mr. Bell and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education designate the firm of Anton and Sendzik, (Principal, Mr. Martin B. Open Public
Portion

At 9:01 p.m. motion was made by Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Bittmann and unanimously agreed to open this meeting for public discussion.

After many questions from members of the audience on a variety of subjects, Mr. Williams read a Curriculum and Instruction Committee report.

Audience participation was continued until 9:30 p.m. at which time Mr. Stutts read a resolution to go into closed session for the reasons of discussing possible litigation concerning buildings and grounds, and personnel matters. Mr. Bell made a motion to approve resolution as read, Mr. Donofrio seconded same and it was carried unanimously.

Bus Driver

Informational matter was presented to the board members on details of a proposed suspension of a non-professional employee. Many thoughts were expressed as to the length of suspension and/or termination of employment including disciplinary clauses if the board chose suspension. A conclusion was reached and Mr. Stutts was given direction on how to handle this matter. The only dissenting vote by consensus of board members was by Mr. Bittmann.

A letter from our attorney with regard to a opinion given by him on a question of conflict of interest was referred to and discussed for a short period of time.

The discussion scheduled to be held to discuss possible litigation on a buildings and grounds subject was not held at this time.

Mr. Bertrand asked that consideration be given to going back to an item by item agenda approval rather than a approval of an entire category as is being experimented with now. No change to the former method was agreed to at this time.

Reference was made to the need to hold a hearing on a Student Matter and an agreeable and convenient date to hold same was decided upon by the board members and attorney (June 16th).

At 10:30 p.m. motion was made by Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Bittmann and carried to adjourn this meeting.

Meeting

The Brick Township Board of Education held a Pre-Agenda Meeting at 6:30 p.m. and a Special Public Meeting at 8:00 p.m. in the Administration Building on Monday, June 22, 1981 for the purpose of discussing and acting upon end-of-year items.

Present were: Mr. Hancock, Mr. Bell (6:55 p.m.), Mr. Bertrand, Mr. Bittmann, Mr. Donofrio, Mrs. Fox, and Mr. Williams.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton and Mr. Sendzik.

Sunshine Law

Mr. Stutts annouched that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows on June 18, 1981: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News.

Pre-Agenda

Mr. Hancock began discussion of items on the agenda for approval at the Special Meeting.

Under Building and Grounds, it was clarified that Mr. Bertrand will obtain an appraisal of Laurelton School at no charge.

A motion with regard to architectural work to be done regarding corrective work in substandard classrooms was discussed and objections were heard as to the amount stated to cover said services. A recommendation was made to contact Cramer and Collinson to get a quotation for said architectural service and after receipt of same, to authorize the architectural firm giving the lowest price the job. A Committee was assigned to interview and make said recommendation. It was also directed that the motion on the Action Agenda be reworded to reflect this change.

Mrs. Ursula Burgess was present and answered questions from board members with regard to her position as Custodian of School Monies for the Brick Township Board of Education. Because of a long agenda this evening, it was agreed that Mr. Stutts, Mr. Bell and Mr. Bertrand set up a meeting with Mrs. Burgess to discuss her reports, etc. in more depth. It was also agreed that while these three people are in the Municipal Building meeting with Mr. Burgess, that they should set up a meeting with Mr. Chalakian, Township Engineer with regard to their proposed increase in that department and our need for engineering services. This Committee was directed to report back to the board members after both meetings.

Bill List

The next item which was discussed at length was the vouchers for approval and it was agreed to withhold payment of \$5,200. to Thermal Energy Conservation Inc. pending review of their report

on infra-red testing at the High School.

Personnel items were held to be discussed at closed session. An item under Policy and Auxiliary motions were reviewed.

Mr. Hancock then, at 7:50 p.m., recessed this meeting for 10 minutes before opening up the Special Meeting.

At 8:00 p.m. Mr. Hancock called this meeting to order. A roll call was taken with the same members attending as previously listed. Mr. Stutts again read the Sunshine Law as also read previous to the opening of the Pre-Agenda Meeting.

Motion was made by Mr. Donofrio, seconded by Mr. Bell and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education approve all items (a) through (c) under the title of Building and Grounds.

That the Board of Education approve an approximate expenditure of \$3,850.00 to repair and replace items in various gymnasiums in the school district according to inspection and recommendation in report submitted by Corby Associates.

Motion was made by Mr. Bittmann, seconded by Mr. Donofrio and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education approve all items (a) through (d) under the title of Curriculum and Instruction.
