The Brick Township Board of Education held a meeting on Tuesday, August 16, 1983 in the Administration Building, 101 Hendrickson Avenue for the purpose of discussing Committee reports and to discuss Central Administration negotiations in closed session.

Present were: Mr. Roblenski, Mr. Bittmann (8:04 pm), Mr. Bell, Mrs. Benton, Mrs. DeConde, and Mr. Tremper.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf and Mr. Sendzik.

Dr. Aragona announced that the Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows on August 11, 1983: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News.

Mr. Tremper

Mr. Roblenski asked for Committee reports and Mr. Tremper advised that he has nothing, as yet, on his area of Transportation.

Mrs. Benton

Mrs. Benton reported on approval of State Board of Education streamlined monitoring plan as it appeared in the NJSBA newspaper. The Board of Education discussed the provisions of the monitoring plan whereby absentism in excess of 5% can result in a non-approved category.

Mrs. DeConde

Mrs. DeConde reported on Curriculum Committees. There are five: 1) High School graduation requirements; 2) length of school day and year; 3) Homework; 4) How retired citizens can be utilized; and 5) computer curriculum.

Mr. Roblenski

Mr. Roblenski asked that the following be considered as a Committee project, that is, breaking five credit courses down into 2½ credits on a half year basis. He asked that a study be made of the suggestions and its ramifications.

Mr. Bell

Mr. Bell noted he will meet with the Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent and Business Administrator to discuss establishing a committee for budget preparation.

Mr. Bittmann

Mr. Bittmann reminded board members that a meeting of the Citizens Advisory Committee is scheduled for August 24th in the Administration Building. This Committee will take up the recommended projects as well as projects suggested by the Committee members.

Mr. Tremper

Mr. Tremper noted he wants young people to learn about the responsibilities of computer usage.

Mrs. Benton

Mrs. Benton raised the question of extending summer hours and a consensus vote was taken (5-1) to put this on the August 30th Special Meeting Agenda as an item. This was in reference to the two days ending the week of August 29th.

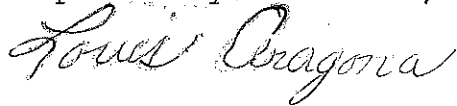
Mr. Roblenski turned to a discussion of negotiations regarding Central Administration and asked if any Board of Education members had any question of the Administrators prior to moving to closed session.
