Present were: Mr. Roblenski, Mr. Bittmann (7:37 p.m.), Mrs. Benton, Mrs. DeConde and Mr. Williams.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Stutts, and Mr. Sendzik (7:45 p.m.)

Mr. Stutts announced that the Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows on September 1, 1983: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News.

A letter from Mayor Newman with regard to township equipment cleaning our school yards on September 1st was read by Mr. Roblenski and direction was given the Board Secretary to express the board's appreciation.

Mr. Stutts reported to board members the possibility that asbestos may be present in the auditorium of Brick Township High School. He explained what testing had been done today and that a report will be prepared by the testing firm and submitted by Friday of this week. If it is more than one percent it will have to be removed, if less than one percent removal is optional.

The next discussion was of the voucher list submitted for payment. Mr. Stutts asked approval of one particular check but noted he will hold same until he checks certain factors. Bids listed were reviewed and approved for the September 14th Action Agenda.

The next category presented by Mr. Stutts was in reference to Teaching Personnel. It was noted that an item to approve an B.T.A.S.A. agreement was being deleted at this time because of difficulty with language. A meeting has been set with negotiators for Monday evening September 12th to further review and conclude this matter.

Non-teaching items were next reviewed and agreement reached. In the area of Auxiliary items it was noted that representatives of HOSA will be present at our Regular Meeting on September 14th.

The employment of Mr. Lofberg to prepare specifications, etc. for our insurance program for the 1984-85 school years was discussed and agreed to.

Mr. Stutts told the board members that additional bids for milk, bread, rolls, etc. are coming in and will be included with the Action Agenda for approval on September 14th.
