Minutes

Motion was made by Mrs. Benton, seconded by Mr. Readell and carried unanimously by roll call vote to approve minutes submitted for August 9, 1984 - Regular Meeting; and August 16, 1984 - Committee Reports, etc.

Asbestos

At 6:50 p.m. the meeting was turned over to Mr. Stutts for an update on the removal of asbestos from this district's schools. Mr. Stutts reviewed his meetings with State Department of Education representatives as well with State Health Department officials.

Mr. Bill Ross Nagel was present to give a final test report on their findings with asbestos testing done. He used the blackboard to spell out the state requirements, or maximum acceptable levels, for asbestos, and the results of the testings done at both Brick Township High School and Veterans Memorial Elementary School.

He noted that with the scanning electron method there is no allowable limit in the State for this method. With the Niosh method the State has an allowable limit of .100.

Mr. Matthew Gillen, industrial hygienist, was present and was asked to submit a report, as soon as possible, on what he had observed while the testing was being done. In a conversation regarding the manner in which the testing was done, Mr. Gillen did agree that it was done in a proper manner.

Motion was made by Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mrs. DeConde and carried unanimously to accept the report submitted by Ross Nagel and Associates, and that the schools be put into full use (by the opening of the auditoriums.).

Closed Session

At 9:10 p.m. a resolution was read by Mr. Stutts, upon the direction of Mr. Roblenski, to go into closed session for the purpose of discussing a matter involving litigation. Motion to accept the resolution was made by Mrs. DeConde, seconded by Mrs. Benton and it carried unanimously. A recess was called and the meeting resumed at 9:55 p.m. This time was needed by our attorney.

Mr. Anton presented the facts in the area of a possible settlement with regard to the matter in litigation. Money figures were presented along with work still to be done and offers of settlement by the contractor. As this matter is still in litigation, details of this discussion cannot be made public. The attorney was authorized to further negotiate the specifics, and it was noted that Mr. Tremper, who is absent this evening, was contacted and did agree to go along with the attorney's recommendation to try and negotiate a settlement. The board members recommended that the Board Attorney make every effort to enhance our monetary position.

Motion was made by Mrs. Benton, and seconded by Mrs. DeConde to approve the motion read by Mr. Anton, as follows: Move that the Board of Education authorize the Board Attorney to enter into final negotiations for the settlement of all issues in the Thomas P. Carney Inc. litigation in accordance with the report submitted to the Board tonight (six pages) and move that the Attorney return to the Board to give all of the final details as to the remedial aspect of the litigation for final approval by the Board of Education at that time.

Dr. Aragona suggested that the motion be rephrased as follows: Move that the Board of Education approve the recommendations of settlement by the Consultant as it appears in the six page document received by it tonight and that the Attorney be authorized to proceed to work out the details of the work that is to be done by Thomas P. Carney, Inc. and thereupon return to the Board of Education for approval of that specific work.

Mrs. Benton withdrew her original motion and Mrs. DeConde withdrew her second of said original motion, after which Mrs. Benton made a motion to approve the one read by Dr. Aragona. Mrs. DeConde seconded it and it carried unanimously.

At 11:10 p.m. motion was made by Mrs. Benton, seconded by Mrs. DeConde and carried unanimously to adjourn.
