WHEREAS: The Board approves of the actions of Robert K. Stutts

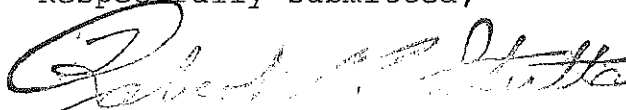
