

D. Period of Leave:POLICY
#4151

An uncompensated leave may be granted for a period of one school year.

E. Commitment of Employee:

The teaching staff member granted an uncompensated leave shall inform the Board within five (5) month of the scheduled return date as to his/her intentions.

F. Commitment of Employer:

At the expiration of the uncompensated leave, the teaching staff member shall be offered a position for which he/she is certified.

Time on uncompensated leave shall not count as time on the job.

Course credit obtained during uncompensated leave may be applied toward credit on the salary schedule.

While on uncompensated leave, a teaching staff member shall be entitled to insurance benefits provided to his/her peers, if he/she pays the premiums therefor, and the insurance carrier approves.

UNCOMPENSATED LEAVE NOT CAUSED BY DISABILITY (Less Than One Year)

The Board recognizes that in certain instances employees may request an uncompensated leave for less than one full year for reasons not caused by disability.

1 Child Care:

Upon approval of the Board of Education, leave shall begin during the school year immediately following termination of disability for pregnancy. The leave shall be granted for the remainder of the school year in which the leave was granted.

2 Other Leave Requests:

Any other request for leave considered an emergency by the Board may be granted on an individual case basis.

ALL UNCOMPENSATED NONDISABILITY LEAVES

The Board of Education shall limit nondisability-type leaves for a period not to exceed three (3) school years at its discretion.

After Mr. Roblenski presented the Important Dates, the Agenda portion of the public meeting was concluded and the audience was asked if there were any questions for discussion at this time.

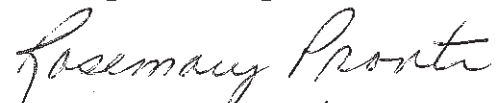

The Board Secretary was requested to write Representative Ford making her aware of the problem and perhaps helping to come up with a solution to this problem or suggest a method to update the present system being used. The present State system is antiquated.

The banks that are holding the bonding issue coupons and the interest amount that is being charged was discussed. The interest is \$869.00 per bank. The debt position at this time is .884% which is very good. It will be required that all equipment be inventoried and their values. Mr. Roblenski, on behalf of the Board, commended Mr. Huss for a job well done.

Dr. Aragona presented items under Curriculum and Instruction and they were accepted.

Items under Finance and Business were presented with everyone in agreement. Included were Voucher payments, transfers of 1984-85 School Year accounts, recording and awarding of bid and acceptance of funds under provisions of P.L.94-482 in the amount of \$50,935.

Teaching Personnel and Non-Teaching Personnel items were reviewed and all accepted.

Policy #4151 was approved for the second reading as previously recorded at the November 15, 1984 Board of Education Regular Meeting.

Auxiliary items were discussed. One of the items was the Report of Level I Monitoring submitted by the Ocean County Superintendent's Office recommending to the Commissioner that the Brick Township Schools be certified for a period of five years. This report is on file at the Board Office for review.

There was a lengthy discussion on the preparation to meet the requirements of the Right to Know Law dealing with hazardous substances. The attorney was requested to review the Legislation.

The next item under discussion was the system used for hiring coaches and assistant coaches in and out of the school district as reviewed by Mr. Roblenski.

Important dates were discussed and approved.
