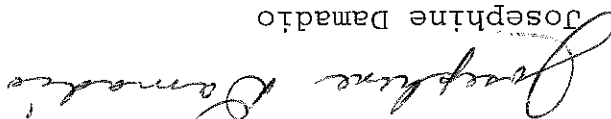

The Brick Township Board of Education held a meeting on Wednesday, June 20, 1984 at 7:00 p.m. in the Administration Building, 101 Hendrickson Avenue for the purpose of discussing and/or acting upon a personnel matter.

Present were: Mr. Roblenski, Mrs. Benton, Mrs. Deconde, Mr. Readell, Mr. Stiles, Mr. Tremper and Mr. Williamson.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf and Mr. Sandzik.

Sunshine Law

Mrs. Damadio announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted on June 18, 1984 by telephoned advice as well as written advice to the Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News, and said notice was also posted on the Board office Bulletin Board.

It was noted that Mr. Frank Racanelli had been placed as to this meeting and had not elected to have this matter discussed in open session. The motion to go into closed session was then read by Mrs. Damadio, as follows:

WHEREAS, C. 231, P.L. 1975, also known as the Sunshine Law, authorizes a public body to meet in executive or private session under certain limited circumstances; and

Closed Session Resolution

WHEREAS, said law requires the Board to adopt a resolution at a public meeting before it can meet in such an executive or private session:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BRICK TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DISTRICT: 1. That it does hereby determine that it is necessary to meet in executive session this date, to discuss matters involving personnel; and 2. That the matter will be made public if and when confidentiality is no longer required and action pursuant to said discussion shall take place only at a public meeting.

Motion was made by Mr. Tremper, seconded by Mrs. Benton and carried unanimously by roll call vote to approve the resolution to go into closed session.

Mr. Racanelli, Mr. Carl John Kerbowski, Attorney, was present with Mr. Frank Racanelli to discuss the nonemployment of Mr. Racanelli as Director of Pupil Personnel Services, as per their request to

to meet with the Board of Education in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, et. seq. This attorney had submitted a petition to the Commissioner of Education on behalf of Mr. Racanelli; said matter is pending before the Commissioner at this time.

Mr. Kerbowksi spoke on behalf of Mr. Racanelli and stated their purpose in being here tonight was to convince the Board that it should not abolish the position-Mr. Racanelli's previously was assigned to. He asked for a reassessment of the recent decision. Mr. Kerbowksi spoke at length of alleged Sunshine Law violations, letters written and received by him in regard to this case, references to Affirmative Action, his contacts with the board attorney, the designation of official newspapers by the Board at their Organization Meeting, dates of decision to call a meeting for April 30th, etc. He added that this matter was open to negotiation at this time, if the Board so desired.

At 7:30 p.m. Mr. Roblenski thanked both Mr. Kerbowksi and Mr. Racanelli for being at this meeting, and noted that when the Board has discussed the matter and reached a decision they would be contacted.

The matter was briefly discussed and a consensus vote taken with unanimous agreement that they will stand on the original decision taken on this matter; that they will stand pat.

At 7:45 p.m. the public meeting was opened by a motion of Mr. Williamson, second of Mr. Stites and unanimous agreement.

Motion was made by Mrs. Benton, seconded by Mrs. Deconde and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education affirm the decision that was made at the April 30, 1984 meeting abolishing the position of Director of Pupil Personnel and the termination of the employment of Mr. Racanelli in that position.

Mr. Racanelli directed that written notice of this decision be given to Mr. Kerbowksi.

At 7:50 p.m. motion was made by Mrs. Benton, seconded by Mrs. Deconde and carried unanimously to adjourn this meeting.

The Brick Township Board of Education held a Special Public Meeting on Tuesday, June 26, 1984 at 7:00 p.m. in the Administration Building, 101 Hendrickson Avenue for the purpose of discussing and acting upon items listed on an Action Agenda.

Present were: Mr. Roblenski, Mrs. Benton, Mrs. DeConde, Mr. Readell, Mr. Stites, Mr. Tremper, and Mr. Williamson.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Murphy and Mr. Sendzik.

Mr. Roblenski directed that Mr. Stutts read the Sunshine Law as follows: The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted on June 21, 1984 as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk, and Brick Town News.

The first item was a discussion of Township/School Board proposed recreational facilities. Dr. Aragona had distributed basic agreements which came to us from Town Hall referring to the McCormick tract, Veterans Memorial Middle and Elementary Complex, and the Lake Riviera Middle School site. There were changes, as per the Board Attorney, to these agreements and copies of recommended changes were distributed to board members. These changes were as a result of meetings with the township engineer and officials.

Mr. Tremper asked for cost figures and Mr. Stutts was able to advise him that there would be approximately \$5000. needed for electrical services, \$2000. for seed, fertilizer and lime, and \$16,000. for equipment. It was noted that the \$16,000. is a one time investment with some of the equipment having possibly a 20 year life span. It was also noted by Mr. Stutts that no additional staffing will be needed for our grounds Department, that the addition of the equipment will offset any need for additional personnel. It was agreed that action would be taken this evening after a resolution had been written to cover the direction the Board wishes to take on this matter.

Motion was made by Mrs. Benton and seconded by Mr. Readell and approved unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education approve the participation of the Lake Riviera Middle School and Veterans Memorial Middle School during the coming school year in the introduction to Vocations Consortium Project, which is being operated by the Ocean County Vocational-Technical School. It is agreed that the district

will pay a fee of \$2,296. (\$4,592. total) for each middle school's participation in project activities.

Motion was made by Mrs. Benton and seconded by Mrs. Deconde and approved unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education approve the proposed summer project which would produce pupil performance objectives in reading for grades 7 and 8, along with a diagnostic reading inventory for both grades. The project would involve the employment of five staff members at \$600. each who would work with Mrs. Oxenford to accomplish this purpose. Total cost for the summer project is \$3,000. This project would be completed prior to the opening of school for the 1984-85 school year.

Motion was made by Mr. Tremper and seconded by Mrs. Deconde and voted unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education approve payment of Vouchers in the amount of \$2,394,314.41 as follows:
