RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Hashad Patel is presently applying to the Brick Township Board of Adjustment for a variance to permit the construction of a 50-unit motel which is not a permitted use in the B-2 Zone; for conditional and final site plan approval and for such bulk variance and design waivers as may be needed for parking space size; distance of parking from right-of-way; distance of access-way from intersecting right-of-way; driveway width; buffer width from property line; building setback distance; buffer width from right-of-way line; sidewalks on Oak Lane as more particularly set forth and the Notice given by applicant pursuant to statute; and

WHEREAS, the above application is for premises located at Chambers Bridge Road and Oak Lane abutting the Garden State Parkway to the North in the Township of Brick and designated on the Township Tax Map as Lots 3-12, 15-22 in Block 726 and located in the B-2 Zone; and

WHEREAS, said applicant is also requesting the Board of Adjustment to invoke its ancillary jurisdiction to secure site plan approval; and

WHEREAS, a first hearing was had on said application on September 3, 1986; and

WHEREAS, the premises in question are within 200' of school premises occupied by the Brick Township High School; and

WHEREAS, representatives of the Board of Education were present at the initial hearing; and

WHEREAS, there were many objections to the application including, but not limited to:

- (a) the inherent problems to be created by the very nature of its proximity to the Brick Township High School as an attractive nuisance;
- (b) its adverse impact on traffic conditions and the attendant danger to the school population;
- (c) inadequate parking.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, after carefully considering the impact that the proposed action will have on the Board of Education's school facility, the Board of Education wishes to be on record as strongly objecting to the granting of the relief requested in said application by Hashad Patel and strongly urges the Board of Adjustment to reject the variance and site plan approval; and
