RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Education and the State Board already have significant powers to intervene in deficient school districts; and

WHEREAS, it is critical that a board of education be retained as an entity, even in the event of extreme state action; and

WHEREAS, we believe that only those board members and administrators who impede the provision of a thorough and efficient education of students should be removed; and

WHEREAS, it is vital that teachers be included in any intervention process that determines which staff members shall stay or be removed and

WHEREAS, when a major cause of a district's deficiencies are due to inadequate resources, the state must provide an extraordinary appropriation to address those deficiencies;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Brick Township Board of Education support the New Jersey School Board's Association's amendments to the "Proposal to Intervene in Deficient School Districts"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the district legislators and to the members of the Senate and Assembly education committees.

The following Resolution was approved at the October 2, 1986 Board of Education Meeting:

RESOLUTION
LAURELTON
SITE

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey, Department of Transportation has found it necessary to acquire certain premises more particularly hereinafter described for the purpose of road construction for the improvement of that facility situate and located in the Township of Brick known as the Laurelton Traffic Circle; and

WHEREAS, certain negotiations have transpired between representatives of the Brick Township Board of Education and the Department of Transportation, Right-of-Way Division as to the amount to be paid to the Board of Education of the Township of Brick for the premises in question; and

WHEREAS, said negotiations have resulted in an agreement for said payment to be made by the State of New Jersey to the Board of Education in the sum of \$35,000.00 minus \$350.00 for the retention by the Board of Education of its flag pole reflecting a total sum of \$34,650.00 to be actually received by the aforesaid Board of Education of the Township of Brick.

Said premises are described as follows:

All that certain land and premises, situate, lying and being in the Township of Brick, in the County of Ocean and State of New Jersey and particularly described as follows:

Parcels R85 and 85B, as indicated on a map entitled: "New Jersey Department of Transportation, GENERAL PROPERTY PARCEL MAP, ROUTE 70 (1953) SECTION 14, Garden State Parkway to Herbertsville Road, Showing Existing Right of Way and Parcels To Be Acquired In The Townships Of Lakewood And Brick, County Of Ocean, Scale: As Indicated, January 1985"; and as shown more particularly on a map entitled: "NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, ROUTE 70 SECTION 14, GARDEN STATE PARKWAY TO HERBERTSVILLE ROAD, PARCELS R85 & 85B, TOWNSHIP OF BRICK, COUNTY OF OCEAN, SCALE: AS INDICATED AUGUST 4, 1986.;

Parcel R85, including specifically all the land and premises located at about Station 118+20 (Base Line Route 88 Stationing), bounded on the north by the existing right of way line of State Highway Route 88 (1953); on the east by lands now or formerly of Route 88 Office Associates; on the southeast by the proposed right of way line of State Highway Route 70 (1953) Section 14,

as laid down on the aforesaid maps; and on the west by lands now or formerly of Louis R. Cavallo and Anthony Vizzone; all as shown on the aforesaid maps; containing 0.114 acre more or less;

Parcel 85B, including specifically all the land and premises at about Station 20+00 (Base Line Princeton Avenue Stationing), bounded on the north by the proposed line of Princeton Avenue, as laid down on the aforesaid maps; on the east and south by the existing westerly and northerly line of Princeton Avenue; and on the west by lands now or formerly of First Jersey National Corporation; all as shown on the aforesaid maps; containing 0.015 acre more or less;

TOGETHER WITH the right to form and maintain slopes for grading the said State Highway Route 88 (1953) as far as the line marked "Slope E" on the aforesaid maps, including the right to top soil, seed, plant trees, vines and shrubs and to maintain the same so as to stabilize the soil, prevent erosion and/or to improve the aesthetic aspects of the highway; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the slope easement may be annulled only after the State has been given sufficient notice to remove the aforementioned stabilizing and landscaping items and by furnishing and maintaining adequate support or protection for the highway so as to make the continuance of the slope right unnecessary;

AND ALSO all right, title and interest that the owner may have in Route 88 East and Princeton Avenue contiguous to the above described premises as shown on the aforesaid maps;

Being also known as part of Lot 6 in Block 867 on the tax map of the Township of Brick;

SUBJECT TO all public utility easements recorded or unrecorded affecting the herein described premises.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education accept the above offer contingent upon the reconstruction of curbing and sidewalks at the Laurelton School site by the State of New Jersey at no cost or expense to the Board of Education and that Robert Roblenski be and is hereby authorized to sign and execute an Agreement of Sale, Deed of Conveyance and any and all other documents necessary for said transfer of title to the State of New Jersey or its proper subdivision or department for the herein described premises and Robert K. Stutts is authorized to attest said signature as Secretary of the Board of Education.
