

PROCEDURE: Step #5 If the grievant is not satisfied at this level, an appeal may be made within five working days to the Brick Board of Education which ~~will~~ hear the complaint at the next regular meeting or within thirty calendar days. (Use Appeal - Form). Local Board hearing shall be conducted so as to accord due process to all parties involved in the complaint such as written notice of hearing dates, right to counsel, right to present witnesses and the right to cross examine and to compel the attendance of witnesses. DISCRIMINATION PROCEDURE CONT'D

Step #6 The Brick Board of Education shall respond to the grievant within twenty calendar days. (Use space provided for on Appeal - Form C).

Step #7 If the grievant is not satisfied with the Board's decision, the grievant may file the complaint to the Director of the Office for Civil Rights, Washington, D.C. The grievant maintains the right to by-pass the grievance procedure and submit the complaint directly to the Office for Civil Rights.

Grievance Forms A, B and C are available in each of the Administrative offices in the district and from the Affirmative Action Officer/Grievance Officer.

Dr. Aragona answered that for years we have been accused of changing report card dates so that students may participate in athletics, now with the new policy we should implement it as it was intended. Dr. Aragona had requested Data Processing to get the marks out as quickly as possible. Mr. Wolf stated that he was unaware that the date for issuing report cards had been moved up and he wanted to get the Board's feelings on the matter. Dr. Aragona then asked Mr. Mayer to explain the policy. Mr. Mayer explained that elementary student report cards always go out before Thanksgiving and parents had questioned in the past why high school report cards could not be done at the same time. This year it was decided to make a concerted effort to get marks out early. Board members were in agreement that they were happy with the new policy and they agree that report cards should be issued as soon as possible.

AUDIENCE

A member of the audience asked how many days are in each of the three remaining marking periods. The answer was 46 or 47. She also mentioned a problem she was having regarding buses. Mr. Roblenski asked Mr. Stutts to investigate her problem. Another question was asked from the audience regarding the awarding of the bid for intercom systems in some of the schools.

There being no further questions from the audience, Mr. Roblenski stated that the Board would be going into closed session. Motion was made by Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. Stites and carried unanimously by roll call vote to go into closed session. Mr. Stutts was then asked to read the Resolution to go into closed session. After a five minute adjournment, the meeting went into closed session to hold a student hearing and to discuss negotiations.
