POLICY #
6145R

PART 1 - ATHLETICS

A. Grades 9-12

1. Annually, at the beginning of the school year, each student shall be given a copy of the academic requirements for student extracurricular activities eligibility.
2. Unsatisfactory achievement reports shall be issued at the mid-point of each marking period for those courses that a student is in danger of failing. These reports will serve as a warning notice to those students involved in athletics that a loss of eligibility is imminent.
3. The eligibility status of students participating in athletics will be determined upon issuance of report cards.
4. A student who fails more than one subject during his/her sports season shall be declared ineligible for the duration of the next marking period.
5. The high school principal shall be responsible for the enforcement of the athletic eligibility policy.

B. Grades 7-8

1. Unsatisfactory achievement reports shall be issued at the mid-point of each marking period. These reports will serve as a warning notice to those students participating in athletics that loss of eligibility is imminent.
2. A student who receives an unsatisfactory grade (E) in more than one subject during his/her sports season shall be declared ineligible for the duration of the next marking period.
3. The eligibility status of students participating in athletics will be determined upon issuance of report cards.
4. The office of the principal shall have final determination in matters relating to athletic eligibility.

PART 11 - NON-ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES

A. Grades 9-12

1. The regulatory procedures outlined above for interscholastic athletics shall also apply for non-athletic activities.

2. Specific extracurricular activities covered by this policy are:
 - a. auxiliary athletic activities-cheerleaders, managers, and statisticians;
 - b. band and auxiliary marching units;
 - c. Fine Arts-chorus and play productions;
 - d. publications - school year book and school newspaper.

B. Grades 7 - 8

1. The regulatory procedures outline above for athletics in grades 7 - 8 shall also apply to non-athletic activities.
2. The principal shall determine the extracurricular activities which are to be covered by this policy.

POLICY ON PROFESSIONAL STAFF ATTENDANCE

Being aware of its responsibility to provide a thorough and efficient system of public education, and recognizing that continuity of instruction is a prerequisite to high student achievement, the Board of Education shall institute a merit honorarium system for good attendance by members of the professional staff.

The Superintendent of Schools shall promulgate regulations for the implementation of this Policy.

PROFESSIONAL STAFF ATTENDANCE
REGULATIONS

The Board of Education shall present to teaching staff members, who are eligible in accordance with the regulations below, a merit honorarium of \$100. This award will be presented by July 30 following the end of the school year. For a staff member to earn a merit honorarium, the following conditions must be met; all of which are subject to computations as determined by the Board of Education solely.

1. Total absenteeism for all professional staff (teachers and administrators) shall be at or below 3.5% for the period commencing July 1 to June 30 of the year the policy is in effect. And, if the individual staff member's occasional absences for personal illness, personal leave days and/or death in the family days, exclusive of the Board approved leaves mentioned below, do not exceed three (3) days.
2. Days on which teachers are absent from their

2. employment due to illness, personal reasons (days) and/or death in the family shall be considered occasional teacher absences*for computing the absentee rate under the policy. Authorized professional days shall be excluded from the computation. Long term absences for illness (more than five (5) consecutive school days) and Board of Education approved leaves shall be excluded in computing the occasional absentee rate. Absences on legal holidays shall be excluded when computing absentee rates.
3. Professional staff members on leaves of absence shall not be eligible for the merit honorarium under the policy.
4. Professional staff members eligible for the merit honorarium under the policy shall be in the employ of the Board from:
 - a) July 1 to June 30 for 12 month employees, and
 - b) September 1 to June 30 for 10 month employees.
5. Professional staff members who are in attendance every day that the schools are in session, exclusive of administratively approved professional days, shall be deemed in perfect attendance, and, therefore, eligible for the merit honorarium regardless of the district record of attendance.
6. Any absence for illness shall require a medical certificate.

*An occasional absence is an absence from school for five(5) or less days.

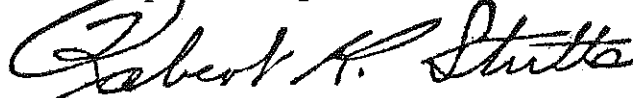

Mrs. Benton declared the Budget Hearing opened at 7:55 p.m. Mr. Stutts presented the Budget. Mr. Stutts stated that since the Budget was adopted a number of changes took place. On February 10th, State Aid was reduced and the Budget had to be redone. On March 10th there was reduction of \$564,763; however, we received notice that we will receive \$195,713 which would then reduce the \$564,763 to \$369,050. Mr. Stutts explained that 58% of the Budget is raised from taxes; the rest of the monies come from approval of surplus, miscellaneous, investments and debt service aid.

Due to the loss of State Aid, there will be an increase of 1.4¢ in taxes. By the end of summer \$369,050. may come back from the State and there could be a decrease of 1¢ in the tax rate.

AUDIENCE

The meeting was then opened to the public for questions. Mr. Stutts answered several questions from the audience regarding the 1985-86 surplus and cost of repairs to the heating system at Memorial High School. Dr. Aragona answered several questions regarding legal fees for the Board attorneys. He said the attorneys are on a retainer and the Board does not have to spend any additional monies for legal fees.

There being no further questions from the audience, Mr. Stutts read the motion to approve the Budget.

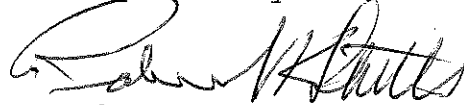
