

While on uncompensated leave, a teaching staff member shall be entitled to insurance benefits provided to his/her peers, if he/she pays the premiums therefor, and the insurance carrier approves.

POLICY #

CONT'D

UNCOMPENSATED LEAVE NOT CAUSED BY DISABILITY (less Than One Year)

The Board recognized that in certain instances employees may request an uncompensated leave for less than one full year for reasons not caused by disability.

1. Child Care:

Upon approval of the Board of Education, leave shall begin during the school year immediately following termination of disability for pregnancy. The leave shall be granted for the remainder of the school year in which the leave was granted.

IN CASES OF CHILD CARE LEAVES IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING A MATERNITY LEAVE, THE TEACHER WHO GIVES BIRTH PRIOR TO FEBRUARY 1 SHALL BE ENTITLED TO CHILD CARE LEAVE TO THE END OF THE CURRENT SCHOOL YEAR. IF THE CHILD'S BIRTH TAKES PLACE FEBRUARY 1 OR LATER OF THE CURRENT SCHOOL YEAR, THE TEACHER SHALL BE ENTITLED TO CHILD CARE LEAVE FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE CURRENT YEAR AND THE ENTIRE NEXT SCHOOL YEAR, BUT LIMITED THERETO. THE CHILD CARE LEAVE MAY BE EXTENDED AT THE SOLE DISCRETION OF THE SUPERINTENDENT.

2. Other Leave Requests:

Any other request for leave considered an emergency by the Board may be granted on an individual case basis.

ALL UNCOMPENSATED NONDISABILITY LEAVES

ALL UNCOMPENSATED LEAVE OF ABSENCES SHALL BE LIMITED TO ONE(1) ENTIRE SCHOOL YEAR ONLY. THE ONLY EXCEPTION IS THE CHILD CARE LEAVE AS DESCRIBED IMMEDIATELY ABOVE.
