Dr. Aragona presented the Agenda. Under Curriculum and Instruction, item (a) was discussed. Item (b) was the introduction of Mr. Mayer, Assistant Superintendent of Schools, who gave a very interesting and informative presentation on the steps which our district has taken to prepare students for HSPT. Mr. Mayer, the Board Members and Administrators are encouraged that this new test will challenge students to reach and expand their capabilities. The district will do everything possible to help students to do well on the HSPT.

POLICY #3515.2 - FACILITIES USE - NO SMOKING

POLICY #4118.231 - PERSONNEL - SMOKING

In order to protect pupils and employees from an environment which is offensive to them and potentially dangerous to their health, the Board of Education prohibits smoking on school premises and vehicles owned or utilized by the school district.

For purposes of this policy, "smoking" means the burning of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe or any other matter or substance for smoking.

Mr. Roblenski mentioned that he has a problem with this Policy because he knows the difficulty of habitual smokers in trying to stop. He commended the Board for offering employees a program to stop smoking. It is an excellent program and he encourages employees to take advantage of it and hopes the Board will continue to offer the program.

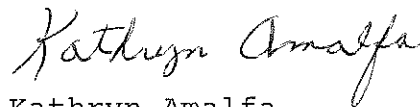
Auxiliary items were presented and agreed upon.

In the National Language Arts Olympiad, Heather Rotondi and Terry Thompson of Veterans Memorial Middle School both had perfect scores. Stanley Pokrywka, from Brick Township High School received recognition for receiving a scholarship to West Point. Michele Favire, BTHS, was congratulated for taking first place in the Regional VICA competition. Robert Kalinowski, BTHS, took first place in the JCP&L Statewide Poster Contest. Rick Zigari, BTHS, was honored by being named top soloist at the Band Festival in Maryland. Chereece Harris was recognized for her performances in performing arts at BTMHS. Judy Thomas, BTMHS, was congratulated for her outstanding leadership in the Key Club this year. Shani Hilsheimer, BTMHS, has been selected to participate in the Governor's Fine Arts school this summer and her painting will hang in the Halls of Congress for one year. Mrs. Hedden, Band Director from BTMHS, congratulated David Buckle, an outstanding soloist, for winning three awards at the Jazz Festival.
