Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts and Mr. Sendzik.

1987-88 SY

1. Seventy-five percent of eighth grade students (662) will achieve a passing score on an essay test designed to measure the ability of students to write a critical persuasive response to a given situation. The essay test will be administered at the end of the school year and will be scored randomly using a standardized scoring procedure taken from the Ennis-Weir Critical Thinking Test.
2. As the result of revision of the Family Life Education curriculum, ninety percent of seventh grade students (685) will demonstrate mastery of basic information about Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) by attaining a passing score or better on a locally developed test to be administered at the conclusion of the unit of study.
3. As the result of participation in the program, Here's Looking at You, 2000, eighty percent of third grade students (634) will demonstrate an understanding of the steps needed to make pro-health decisions and the physical and behavioral effects of commonly used drugs by attaining a passing score or better on a locally developed test to be administered at the conclusion of the school year.
4. Ninety percent of ninth grade students (856) will achieve a passing score of 61 or more on the mathematics section of the State High School Proficiency Test, which will be administered April, 1988.
