The Brick Township Board of Education held a Special Meeting on Wednesday, November 18, 1987 in the Administration Building, 101 Hendrickson Avenue, at 12:00 noon for the purpose of approving transportation contracts.

Present were: Mrs. DeConde, Mr. Laura, Mr. Readell, Mr. Williamson, Mr. Roblenski.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Stutts and Mr. Sendzik.

Mr. Stutts announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

SUNSHINE LAW
