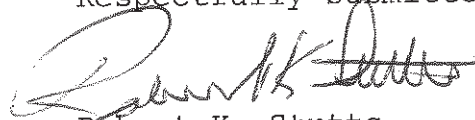
CLOSED

Following the Student Hearing, which began at 7:00 p.m. in closed session, the meeting went into open session at 7:30 p.m.

Present were: Mrs. DeConde, Mrs. Benton, Mr. Laura, Mr. Readel, Mr. Stites, Mr. Williamson and Mr. Roblenski.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton, Sr. and Mr. Mayer.

SUNSHINE LAW

Mr. Stutts announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted on January 29, 1987 as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News.

Motion was made by Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mrs. Benton and carried unanimously by roll call vote to go into open session at 7:30 p.m.

Mr. Roblenski explained to the audience that this was a combined meeting so items would be discussed and then voted on.

MINUTES

Motion was made by Mr. Readel, seconded by Mr. Laura and carried by the following roll call vote to approve the minutes of the January 8, 1987 combined meeting: Mrs. DeConde, abstain; Mr. Laura, yes; Mr. Readel, yes; Mr. Stites, abstain; Mr. Williamson, yes; Mrs. Benton, yes; and Mr. Roblenski, yes.

CURRIC- ULUM & INSTRUC.

Under Curriculum & Instruction, Item (a), Mr. Wolf presented an update on the Drug Programs underway in Brick Township. He mentioned to the audience and the Board that Ms. Finn has had many meetings with teachers and students and there are numerous programs which are ongoing. Mr. Shupin is sponsoring BAD day, (Brick Against Drugs); one successful program was held in October and the followup will be Monday, February 9, 1987. Attorney General Edwards will be the keynote speaker at this BAD meeting. Parents and students are welcome. As a spinoff of the BAD program, people are being trained in how to handle drug problems. Opinion polls and surveys have been taken. When pertinent information is available, it will be presented to the Board. Mr. Wolf praised the Rotarians for raising much money for this program. At the conclusion of Mr. Wolf's presentation, Mr. Roblenski stressed to the audience the importance of this BAD meeting, which will be held February 9, at 7:30 p.m. in the Brick Township High School Auditorium.

Item (d), which was to recognize certain teachers, was explained by Mr. Mayer. These teachers have distinguished themselves and will be invited to a statewide convocation and will be awarded \$1,000. to be used for teaching programs. C & I Cont'd.

Motion was then made by Mrs. Benton, seconded by Mr. Laura and carried unanimously by roll call vote to approve items (a,b,c,d) under Curriculum & Instruction as follows:

Item (a) Mr. Wolf's presentation on Drug Programs.

Item (b) Motion that the Board of Education approve the Application for the Basic Skills Improvement Project (BSIP) in the amount of \$1,245,105. Funding for the Application derives from ECIA: Chapter I (384,625.) and State Compensatory Education (SCE) \$860,480.

Item (d) Motion that the Board of Education certify the following teachers as participants in the 1986-87 Governor's Teacher Recognition Program. The teachers were selected in accordance with the selection process set by law (c.322, P.L.1985).
