The Board and Administrators are aware of the problems at Drum Point School and they will be addressed as soon as physically possible. Township Building Inspectors and Fire Inspectors have checked the building and found no structural damage nor any hazards. Some parents felt there was black mold on the walls. Mr. Wolf assured them that if this proved to be the case, it would be removed immediately. The possibility of replacing the flat roof with a pitched roof was discussed, with Mr. Laura explaining that a pitched roof is not practical.

Another parent from Osbornville asked again about the possibility of installing an intercom system at Osbornville School. Mr. Stutts informed her that he is awaiting a proposal from a company who installs these systems. The parent of a kindergarten student expressed her concern that kindergarteners are being required to do too much work. Dr. Aragona addressed her concerns.

That the matter discussed will be made public if and when confidentiality is no longer required and action pursuant to said discussion shall take place at a public meeting.

Motion was made by Mrs. DeConde, seconded by Mr. Williamson and approved by unanimous roll call vote to go into closed session.

After a three minute recess, the meeting went into closed session.
