There being no comments from Board members, nor any comments or questions from the audience, Mr. Roblenski declared a ten minute recess.

PUBLIC
HEARING

At 8:10 p.m., Mr. Roblenski declared the Public Hearing Meeting opened.

Mr. Stutts presented the Budget for the 1987-88 school year on behalf of the Board and Administrators. Mr. Stutts pointed out to the audience that the Budget is a result of many meetings with principals, administrators and Board members. When it is approved temporarily by the Board, it is then sent to the County offices for their approval. Mr. Stutts feels that this is a good budget. There will be a tax increase, but over the past ten years, the Board of Education has given back \$11 million so they could hold down the tax rate. The reduction in State Aid this year has caused a 7.5¢ raise in the tax rate. Our budget is up \$3.3 million. School budgets in surrounding areas are up also. Mr. Stutts explained that the 1987-88 budget allocates 52.28% for education. Fixed charges make up 15.11%; Transportation 8.61%; Operation of Facilities 8.13%; Capital Outlay .64%; Student Body Activities 1.67%; Attendance .005%; Special Schools 4.22%; Administration 2.62%; Maintenance 2.14%; Debt Service 2.86%; and Health 1.63%. We are still under our cap. We spend \$3139.00 per pupil, which is \$1000.00 below the state average. The budget attempts to address all important educational programs.

There being no questions from the audience, motion was made by Mr. Stites, seconded by Mr. Readel and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education adopt the proposed 1987-88 School Budget as follows:

CONT'D

All Board members expressed the view that this is a fair budget and that we are being penalized by the State of New Jersey because we run the district so efficiently that our appropriations are cut. It is felt that parents should point out to legislators that we are made up of a large percentage of senior citizens who are on a fixed income. Mr. Roblenski remarked that our staff and students' performance has been exceptional even though we operate on a low budget. It is hoped that concerned parents will see that this budget is passed.

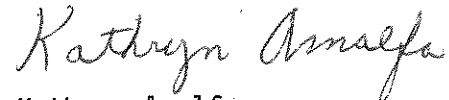
A question from the audience was addressed as to what happens to the budget if it is not passed by the voters.

Mr. Wolf read the Resolution to go into closed session for the purpose of conducting a Student Hearing. Motion was made by Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mrs. DeConde and carried by unanimous roll call vote to approve said Resolution.

STUDENT
HEARING

The Student Hearing was conducted by Mr. Sendzik, Board Attorney, with the following recommendations being made after much deliberation by the Board. These findings were given regarding student T.K.: student T.K. will be on Bedside Instruction until April 20, 1987. Student should continue with Psychological Therapy and have a follow-up visit regarding his counseling sessions. Upon his return to school, he will serve fifteen days in detention. He will not participate in 8th grade promotion exercises. He will not participate in any student activities for the remainder of the school year. He is not to be on school property, except for school business. He will prepare a written report of no less than twenty pages, regarding prescription and non-prescription drugs, under the direction of the middle school principal. He will receive counseling from Mrs. Angie Finn, Student Assistance Counselor; and the middle school principal will decide his placement of class for the remainder of the school year. Expungement of these proceedings will take place, if, at the

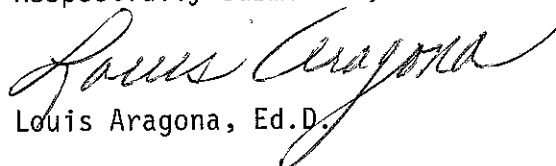
