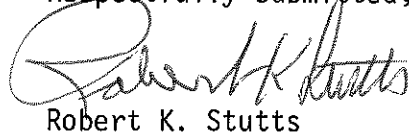

Their insurance coverage was checked, and the parking lot would be available for the time they wish to use it. Also a circus would like to use property at Lake Riviera Middle School on Memorial Weekend. They also have full insurance coverage and the circus will arrange for all cleanup to be done.

Mr. Wolf asked the Board if they had any objections. Questions were raised by several Board Members regarding our insurance liability for these events and also regarding the exact sites to be used. The Board was assured that both groups have adequate insurance and even though the Board is not involved, we would still be covered by our own insurance. Mr. Wolf mentioned that we have had similar situations in the past without problems. It was the consensus of the Board that the groups should be allowed to use the school sites as requested.

Mr. Roblenski brought to the Board's attention a piece of legislature from Governor Kean regarding stronger penalties for drug selling within 1000' of a school, school property or on a school bus. Mr. Roblenski would like to have it printed on large poster paper and posted in the schools, especially the high schools.

At this point it was decided that a vote was necessary on the use of school grounds for the Brick Hospital Fair and the Circus.
