### R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Homeowners of Greenbriar, Inc. wish to establish an educational Scholarship Trust for the purpose of promoting harmony and understanding between the Greenbriar Community and the Community of Brick at large; and

WHEREAS, the Homeowners of Greenbriar, Inc. through their Board of Directors, have authorized the establishment of such a Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of said fund shall be the awarding of two scholarships annually in equal amounts to one senior student from each of the High Schools within the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Township of Brick has recognized the Homeowners of Greenbriar, Inc.'s past efforts in developing better communications and understanding between the Greenbriar Community and the Brick Township school system and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education finds that the establishment of a scholarship fund will promote continued relationships between the Greenbriar community and the school district and will be a benefit to students within the Township; and

WHEREAS, a Trust known as the Homeowners of Greenbriar, Inc. Scholarship Annuity Trust settting forth the above purpose has been established by the Homeowners fo Greenbriar, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, said Trust sets forth the criteria upon which the students to receive the scholarship fund shall be based, to wit;

- (1) Recipients must be scholastically in the top 5% of their class and be morally fit, as judged by commonly accepted standards of our community;
- (2) Scholastic consideration shall be the primary criteria, however, financial need may be considered under certain circumstances provided the recipient scholastically falls

within the top 5% of his or her class;  
(3) Those individuals set forth above selecting the recipient shall have latitude within the bounds of the above set forth criteria in making their determination;  
(4) Scholarship funds must be used for educational purposes within the United States of America only; and  
WHEREAS, said Trust Agreement names the Brick Township Board of Education as Trustee of said Trust.  
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of the Township of Brick that they accept the Trust assets described in the aforementioned Trust Agreement and agree to undertake the duties and responsibilities as Trustee for said Trust; and  
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board President and Secretary execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the aforementioned Trust; and  
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that to acknowledge the efforts of the Homeowners of Greenbriar, Inc. in promoting harmony and understanding within the community and particularly within the school district that a plaque be placed in each of the respective High Schools within the district commemorating these efforts and upon which the names of the recipients of the annual scholarship award shall be inscribed; and  
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a replica of the plaque above mentioned be given to the Homeowners of Greenbriar, Inc.

HOMEOWNERS OF GREENBRIAR, INC.,  
SCHOLARSHIP ANNUITY TRUST

The purpose of this Trust is the promotion of harmony and understanding between the Greenbriar Community and the Community of the Township of Brick by the creation of an irrevocable Trust establishing an annual scholarship award for one senior student graduate in each of the two High Schools in the Brick Township School District. The two High Schools being known as the Brick Township High School and The Brick Township Memorial High School.

The Homeowners of Greenbriar, Inc. hereinafter called the Trustor, create a Trust Fund of the property hereinafter set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof, which has been delivered this date to the Brick Township Board of Education, a quasi-municipal corporation in the Township of Brick, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, hereinafter called the Trustee.

This Trust Fund shall be known as the Homeowners of Greenbriar, Inc. Scholarship Annuity Trust.

The Trustor hereby give, transfer and deliver the property described in Exhibit "A" to the Trustee in trust for the hereinabove set forth purpose. The Trustor and the Trustee hereby agree that the property given and transferred to the Trustee this date together with its income and profits and any other sums which may be derived from said property or any other sums which may be transferred to the Trustee or their successors from the Trustor shall be held in Trust by the Trustee pursuant to the uses, purposes and under the guidelines set forth in this Agreement.

The Trustee shall hold the Trust property and in their discretion invest all or parts of it in secure interest bearing accounts, taking into consideration the highest possible yield. Income generated from the investment of the Trust property shall be announced and awarded at the graduation ceremonies of the above mentioned High Schools

annually commencing June, 1988 in equal amounts to one senior student from each High School who shall be selected by the Superintendent of Schools and the Principal of the respective High Schools. Selection of the student recipient shall be made on the basis of the following criteria:

(1) Recipients must be scholastically in the top 5% of their Class and be morally fit, as judged by commonly accepted standards of our community;

(2) Scholastic consideration shall be the primary criteria, however, financial need may be considered under certain circumstances provided the recipient scholastically falls within the top 5% of his or her class;

(3) Those individuals set forth above selecting the recipient shall have latitude within the bounds of the above set forth criteria in making their determination;

(4) Scholarship funds must be used for education purposes within the United States of America only.

The Trustor may, at any time and from time to time, transfer and deliver to the Trustee additional cash or other property which shall thereupon become part of the Trust estate and shall be held and disposed of by the Trustee in all respects subject to the provisions of this Trust. The Trust investments, whether originally or subsequently transferred to the Trustee, shall be treated as a single Trust.

The Trustee shall be chargeable only with the exercise of good faith in carrying out the provisions of the Trust. The Trustee shall not, in the absence of bad faith, be responsible or accountable for error or judgement.

The Trustee shall not receive compensation for their services.

Gifts to the Trustee shall be irrevocable.
