The student will remain on close monitoring by our staff for progress, both academic and deportment wise.

Finally, the student will be on probation for the remainder of the school year.

AUDIENCE

Some discussion followed regarding the possible cost of this proposed warehouse, and the feelings of most Board Members that a new warehouse was an absolute necessity. Mr. Stutts answered a question of a member of the audience who wondered if it would be possible to renovate the present warehouse. Mr. Stutts stated it would cost more to repair than to build new. No referendum is necessary as the State has already given the Board their approval for this project.
