DISCUSS STUDENT DEPLOYMENT PLAN

One of the items under Auxiliary was to approve the Student Deployment Plan K-8. This brought on much discussion from the audience and the Board Members regarding the pros and cons of this plan. Members of the audience who live in the Cherie Manor section were upset that their children are being moved to a new school for September. Mr. Wolf stated that there is no perfect plan and this seemed the best for all concerned. The division was made geographically to try to achieve equal class size throughout the district.
