WHEREAS, the Board feels under the present formula it is unable to provide the mandated, thorough, efficient education for the students within the district;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of the Township of Brick that they urge the State Legislature to rewrite the formula for distributing State aid to public schools:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Governor, Senate, Assembly, Commissioner of Education, County Superintendent, local legislators and local PTO and PTA's.

as well as the students from both high schools who achieved honor grades and those who took part in the Brick Township High School Art Fair.

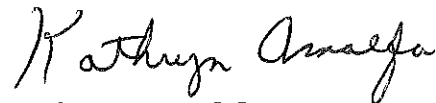

A letter will be written to the Township to ask if it is possible to use another building for polling place instead of Osbornville School. Also a problem will be looked into regarding busing of kindergarten students on last three days of school. Questions were raised regarding a new fence at Midstreams School. Who was responsible for purchasing and installing it? Mr. Stutts explained that during meetings with the Township, plans were made to refurbish Midstreams playground. The Midstreams PTO had raised money for playground equipment and Mayor Newman agreed to add to it and also offered to replace the old fence. A parent from Herbertsville would like to see more money spent on the Arts at the middle school and also questioned how money is spent in the Title I/Comp Ed program. His concerns were addressed by Mr. Murphy. Another parent voiced her concern with the fact that Herbertsville School does not have an All Purpose Room and asked why the Annex is not being used for that purpose. Mr. Wolf stated that the building does not meet State requirements. The Buildings & Grounds Committee was asked to look into the possibility of preparing the building to meet State requirements. Questions were asked concerning the Redeployment Plan of last year and Mr. Leahy was asked to review this plan with administration.

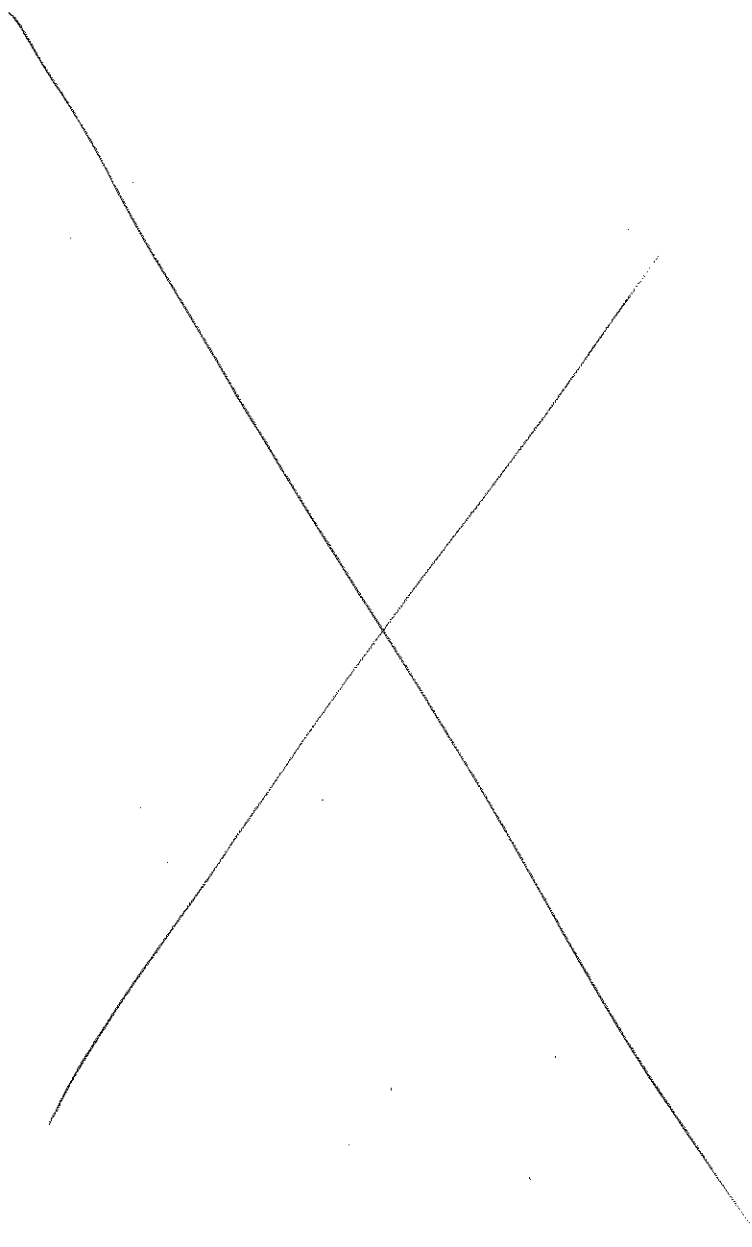
