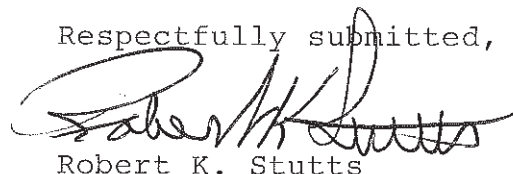

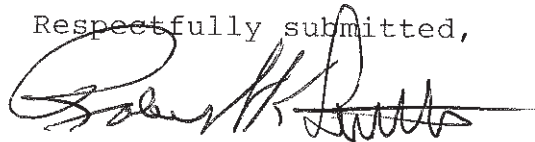

The Adult Basic Skills program is designed to enable students to acquire the skills necessary to function independently as parents, workers, consumers and citizens.

The Adult Basic Education program is designed to provide instruction on basic communication, computation, pre-occupational, civic and everyday living skills for those persons who are least educated and lacking basic educational skills.

The program further prepares persons to take the Tests of General Educational Development (GED) in order to qualify for a state issued high school diploma. The GED program focuses instruction on subject areas covered by the GED test, namely, writing skills, social studies, science, interpreting literature and the arts, and mathematics.

(CONTINUED)

The program will make special efforts to enroll the least educated and minorities groups of Brick Township, especially the growing numbers of Hispanic residents. This will be done through a special campaign of personal contact through church and social organizations and through the school-aged children. The Director of Welfare of Brick Township will identify the homeless and welfare population of Brick, which at this time consists primarily of local 18, 19 and 20 year old youth.

All incoming students will attend an orientation program, including initial testing for class placement, to be followed by individual counselling for proper placement and satisfaction of personal goals. An advisor will be available to meet with students at any time, and will meet with each student at regular intervals to assess progress toward the student's goals.

An annual assessment will be based on the number of persons served, the number of hours of instruction and the progress made by those enrolled, as measured by the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE).
