PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN BOARD MEETINGS

The Board of Education recognizes the value of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on matters of community interest. The Board will accordingly permit members of the public to review all Board of Education Public meeting agendas in the Business Administrator's Office at the Administration Building, 101 Hendrickson Avenue, prior to all regularly scheduled Board agenda meetings and to offer comments at all public meetings of the Board.

It is not advisable that the Board act on items which are not on the agenda, or on which its members do not have full information.

At pre-agenda meetings, members of the public will be permitted to comment on each item appearing on the agenda. The Board President shall call for public comments after district administrators have presented the agenda item and Board members have exhausted their initial questions. When no member of the public wishes to be heard on the item, the President shall close the public comment portion of the agenda item and shall entertain no additional public comment on that item.

At the regular meetings, public comment shall be invited at two separate times on the agenda.

1. Before the Board takes official action on agenda items, members of the public shall be invited to comment on agenda items not presented at the pre-agenda meeting.
2. After the Board has acted on the entire agenda, members of the public shall be invited to comment on any matter relating to the school district. From time to time, items may appear at both pre-agenda and agenda meetings. However, public discussion may be required at the agenda meeting at the discretion of the Board President.

At meetings other than agenda and regular meetings, members of the public will be invited to comment on issues before the Board. Public comment will follow any presentation on the issue offered by district administrators and any questions posed by Board members. At the beginning of any such meeting, the Board President will announce the manner in which public comment will be entertained.

At any meeting of the Board of Education, public participation shall be governed by the following rules:

1. A participant must be recognized by the presiding officer and must preface his or her comments by an announcement of his or her name, place of residence, and group affiliation, if appropriate.
2. Each statement made by a participant shall be limited to three (3) minutes duration.

3. No participant may speak more than once on the same topic unless all others who wish to speak on that topic have been heard.
4. All statements shall be directed to the presiding officer; no participant may address or question Board members individually.
5. That portion of the meeting following agenda business during which the public is invited to participate shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes.

The presiding officer may:

1. interrupt, warn, or terminate a participant's statement when the statement is too lengthy, duplicative, personally directed, abusive, obscene, or irrelevant;
2. request any individual to leave the meeting when that person does not observe reasonable decorum;
3. request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a disorderly person when that person's conduct interferes with the order and progress of the meetings;
4. call for a recess or an adjournment to another time when the lack of public decorum so interferes with orderly conduct of the meeting as to warrant such action;
5. waive these rules when necessary for the protection of privacy or the efficient administration of the Board's business.

ADMINISTRATION

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS JOB DESCRIPTION AND EVALUATION

The Board of Education, in compliance with State law, shall evaluate the tenured Chief School Administrator annually.

If the Chief School Administrator is nontenured, he/she shall be evaluated three times each year. The first and second evaluations will be progress reviews based on the members' observations of the Chief School Administrator's performance of his/her duties and data from appropriate district records and reports. The first and second evaluation conferences will reflect performance to date and include recommendations for future action. The third evaluation shall follow the procedures presented herewith.

The purpose of the evaluation shall be to:

- A. Promote professional excellence and improve the skills of the Chief School Administrator;
- B. Improve the quality of education received by the pupils served by the public schools of the district;
- C. Provide a basis for the review of the job performance of the Chief School Administrator.

The role and responsibility of the Board in this evaluation shall be to:

- A. Review, revise, and adopt procedures suggested by the Chief School Administrator for implementation of this policy;
- B. Determine whether the services of a qualified consultant will contribute substantially to the evaluation process and to engage such a consultant if the Board deems it desirable;

- C. Adopt an individual plan for professional growth and development of the Chief School Administrator based in part upon any needs identified in the evaluation. This plan shall be mutually developed by the Board and Chief School Administrator;
- D. Hold an annual summary conference between a majority of the full membership of the Board and the Chief School Administrator. This conference shall include a review of the Chief School Administrator's performance of the responsibilities outlined in his/her job description as well as a review of the progress he/she has made toward achieving and/or implementing the district's goals program objectives, policies, instructional priorities, State goals and statutory requirements. The annual evaluation of the Chief School Administrator shall be completed by April 30.
- E. Prepare and adopt subsequent to the annual summary conference and with majority approval of the full Board an annual written performance evaluation report. This report shall include:
 - 1. Performance areas of strength;
 - 2. Performance areas needing improvement based upon the job description;
 - 3. Recommendations for professional growth and development;
 - 4. A summary of available indicators of pupil progress and growth and a statement of how these available indicators relate to the effectiveness of the overall program and the performance of the Chief School Administrator;
 - 5. Provision for performance data which have not been included in the report prepared by the Board to be entered into the record by the Chief School Administrator within 10 working days after the completion of the report.

Superintendent of Schools Job Description and Evaluation

The role and responsibility of the Chief School Administrator shall be to provide information and procedures for:

- A. Development of a job description and evaluation criteria based upon the district's goals, program objectives, policies, instructional objectives, State goals, statutory requirements, and the functions, duties, and responsibilities of the Chief School Administrator;
- B. Specification of methods of data collection and reporting appropriate to the job description;
- C. Design of evaluation instruments suitable for reviewing the Chief School Administrator's performance based upon the job description;
- D. Scheduling the required annual conference at an appropriate time and with appropriate information available to allow proper consideration for all the items to be included in the subsequent written performance evaluation report.

After the Board's adoption of the annual written performance report, the Chief School Administrator shall have the option of appending all other appropriate information relative to the evaluation of his/her job performance not contained in the report.

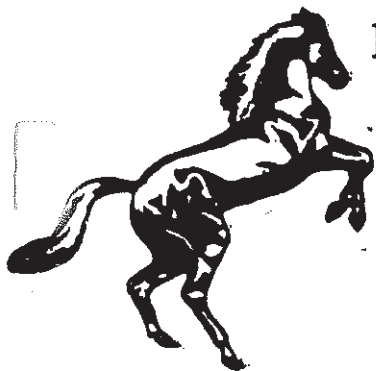

Mrs. Russell mentioned that she had attended the New Jersey School Boards Assembly on Saturday and was glad to report that the majority of Resolutions had been passed. She also praised Mr. Wolf and Mr. Shupin for their work with the Brick Against Drugs program.

Mr. Readell praised Mr. Regan and his staff for the safe evacuation of Brick Township Memorial High School during the recent fire emergency.

A gentleman from the audience complimented the Policy Committee on their fine job of drafting the policy regarding Public Participation in Board Meetings. He also asked the status of the Budget Appeal. Mr. Stutts informed him that the Hearing Officer had requested further information, which had been sent to him, and it would still be a few more weeks before we have an answer. This same gentleman also asked if a determination had been made as to the recent absenteeism problem at Veterans Memorial Middle School. Mr. Wolf stated that the Ocean County Board of Health had taken water samples at VMMS which had been positive. Ten more samples would be taken and as soon as we had the results of them we might know more. At this point it is felt that the problem was a pocket of virus.

Another gentleman from the audience brought up his concerns regarding the motion to revise our method of collecting tax money from the Township. He felt the suggested revised method of collecting monies would cause a problem for the Township and he asked for a ball park figure of what this would do to the Township. Much discussion ensued and it was stated that there was no simple answer as to a ball park figure. This matter will be studied by the Fact Finding Committee to be formed.

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Questions were asked regarding a Policy - 1210 Parent Associations, which had not been approved at a previous meeting. This will be put on the Agenda of January 4 for discussion.

A teacher from the audience asked to comment on the discussion held earlier in the meeting regarding students not saluting the flag. He stated that in the high school all students stand even if they do not salute and if they have a religious conviction against this, they may go outside the room during the flag salute.

Motion was made by Mr. Cevasco, seconded by Mrs. Russell with all in favor to adjourn this meeting at 9:14 p.m.
