The Brick Township Board of Education held a Special Meeting at 7:56 p.m. on November 15, 1972 in the Veterans Memorial Middle School, for the purpose of approving a special election to be held on January 11, 1973 and other matters to come before the board.

President Newman opened the meeting promptly at 7:56 p.m. and called and executive session which lasted until 8:00 p.m.

Motion was made by Mr. Scarpelli, seconded by Mr. Bell, that the Board of Education designate Thursday, January 11, 1973 to hold a Special Election for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of the Township of Brick, a proposition(s) for a building program and that the polls be opened from 2:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m.; and

To have a minimum of five polling places and a maximum of nine polling places for the twenty election districts to alleviate the overcrowding and problems experienced at the October 10, 1972 Special Election; and

To post notices of the election at all schools, post offices, municipal building, fire houses, and various stores; and

To give permission to the Board Secretary, Hilda M. Barbszis, to purchase all necessary supplies for the election, to place in the Observer-Courier-Sun legal notices according to law, and to secure a minimum of ten voting machines, or a maximum of twenty voting machines for the polling places; and

To employ the necessary Chairmen, Secretaries, and Tellers needed to serve at each polling place at the sum of \$2.00 per hour each for said Special Election (a list of names will be submitted at the next Regular Meeting of the Board of Education).

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Township of Brick has determined by a majority vote of its full membership pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:6-11 that there is evidence to support such charges which would be sufficient if true in fact to warrant a dismissal, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:6-14 upon certification to the Commissioner, the Board of Education of the Township of Brick may suspend the said Mary Jane Hill without pay pending final determination of the written charges hereinabove referred to.

CHARGE

Due to a self-admitted problem with alcohol during the school year 1971-72, this has resulted in the following:

As a result thereof, your conduct as hereinabove outlined, has incapacitated you, and rendered you inefficient to continue in your capacity as a tenure teacher.

WHEREAS, said Richard Royer is an employee of the Board of Education of the Township of Brick under tenure, and which charges have been filed with Hilda M. Barbszis, Secretary of the Board of Education of the Township of Brick; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Township of Brick has determined by a majority vote of its full membership pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:6-11 that there is evidence to support such charges which would be sufficient if true in fact to warrant a dismissal; and

NOTICE OF CHARGES OF CONDUCT UNBECOMING A TEACHER
PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 18A:6-10

CHARGE 1: Due to your absence from your teaching duties without notification to the Board of Education, commencing on November 6, 1972 up to and including the date of the within Resolution, you have committed conduct unbecoming a teacher by such unlawful absence and by said failure of notification. In absence of any lawful excuse or defense, and your willful and continued absence, you so continue to be guilty of unprofessional conduct.

CHARGE 2: You have ceased to perform your duties and in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:26-10, said conduct having commenced on November 6, 1972 and continuing to date, you are, therefore, guilty of unprofessional conduct and, pursuant to said statute, your certificate may be suspended by the Commissioner of Education upon receiving notice thereof, and said certificate may be suspended for a period not exceeding one year in the absence of any valid and lawful excuse or defense.

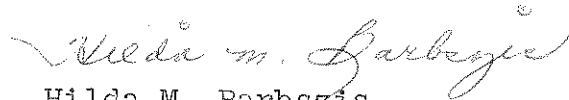

NOTICE TO PERSONS DESIRING ABSENTEE BALLOTS

If you are a qualified and registered voter of the State who expects to be absent outside the State on January 11, 1973, or a qualified and registered voter who will be within the State on January 11, 1973 but because of illness or physical disability, or because of the observance of a religious holiday pursuant to the tenets of your religion, or because of resident attendance at a school, college or university, or, in the case of a school election, because of the nature and hours of his employment, will be unable to cast your ballot at the polling place in your district on said date, and you desire to vote in the SPECIAL SCHOOL election to be held on January 11, 1973, kindly write or apply in person to the undersigned at once requesting that a civilian absentee ballot be forwarded to you. Such request must state your home address, and the address to which said ballot should be sent, and must be signed with your signature, and state the reason why you will not be able to vote at your usual polling place. No civilian absentee ballot will be forwarded by mail to any applicant unless request therefor is received not less than 7 days prior to the election, and contains the foregoing information.

Any civilian absentee voter who fails to apply within the 7-day time prescribed above may apply in person to the county clerk for an absentee ballot on any day up to 3 p.m. of the day before the election.

In the event of sickness or confinement, the qualified voter may apply in writing for and obtain an absentee ballot by authorized messenger so designated over the signature of the voter. The county clerk is authorized to deliver to such authorized messenger a ballot to be delivered to the qualified voter.

NOTICE TO MILITARY SERVICE VOTERS AND TO THEIR RELATIVES AND FRIENDS

If you are in the military service or the spouse or dependent of a person in military service or are a patient in a veterans' hospital or a civilian attached to or serving with the Armed Forces of the United States without the State of New Jersey, or the spouse or dependent of and accompanying or residing with a civilian attached to or serving with the Armed Forces of the United States, and desire to vote, or if you are a relative or friend of any such person who, you believe, will desire to vote in the SPECIAL SCHOOL election to be held on January 11, 1973, kindly write to the undersigned at once making application for a military service ballot to be voted in said election to be forwarded to you, stating your name, age, serial number if you are in the military service, home address and the address at which you are stationed or can be found, or if you desire the military service ballot for a relative or friend then make an application under oath for a military service ballot to be forwarded to him, stating in your application that he is eighteen years of age and stating his name, serial number if he is in military service, home address and the address at which he is stationed or can be found.
