President Schue announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Sunshine Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer and Municipal Clerk on December 13, 1979.

Details of the Special Election were discussed and it was agreed to have same on February 5, 1980 from 4:00 to 9:00 p.m.

A discussion followed with regard to alternate sites which might be used for the proposed elementary school. The McCormick tract was discussed vs. the Lake Riviera site.

The Brick Township Board of Education held their Pre-Agenda Meeting on Wednesday, January 2, 1980 at 7:30 p.m. in the Administration Building.

Present were: Mrs. Riley, Mrs. Fox, Mr. Hancock, Mr. Bertrand, and Mr. Schue (8:00 p.m.)

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton and Mr. Sendzik.

Sunshine Law

Mrs. Riley announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, and Municipal Clerk on December 20, 1979.

Before the agenda items were discussed, Mr. Stutts advised the board that bids had been received for bus chassis and bodies and would be included on the action agenda for January 9th. He further advised that in order to insure August delivery that buses would have to be ordered now. A discussion followed detailing the companies who had bid on these items and need that buses to be purchased to conform to the ones we already have for many reasons including availability of parts.

Mr. Stutts further informed the board that bids would be received on Friday, January 4th for Library Furniture for the new High School and he was told he could include same on the action agenda (low bid on white; other in pink).

Mr. Stutts discussed his meeting with the Lunch Committee on December 12, 1979.

A letter from Duall Maintenance Co. with regard to asbestos in schools was discussed and Mr. Stutts was directed to get prices on the various ways this can be accomplished.

High School Graduation was discussed, Saturday vs. weekday evening. A consensus vote was taken with a 3-2 vote in favor of Saturday.

The Jewish holydays were also discussed as to a suggestion that a policy be formed in this regard. No decision was reached.

The policy books and requested dual setup for easy referral was discussion. Mr. Strauss is to be notified, in writing, that he is not living up to his contract nor the board's expectations.

The selection of school colors and symbol for Memorial High School was referred to after a letter was received from John Santaguida, President of the Student Council. It appears that the school colors will be Green and Gold, and "logo" the Mustang.

The selection of a site for the proposed new elementary school was again discussed. The acreage next to Midstreams School was suggested; also the McCormick tract. Mr. Nixon and Mr. Holcombe, State Department of Education, are expected to tour our schools on Friday, January 11, 1980, and it was anticipated that they will visit these suggested alternate sites for the new elementary school. 1/2/80

Mr. Schue advised that a Special Public Meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 22nd for the purpose of approving the necessary resolution for the February 5, 1980 Special Election ballot.

Mr. Stutts presented a need for a portable lighting system for the High School field for night football and any other activity which may be held there in the evening. He asked if specifications could be prepared to go out for bid for permanent lights, expense could come out of the 1978-79 budget. He was given approval to go ahead and get necessary prices for the system he has in mind.

There being no further business, motion was made by Mrs. Riley, seconded by Mr. Schue and carried unanimously that this meeting be adjourned at 10:30 p.m.
