It was agreed after a question was posed by Mr. Hancock that the board members will discuss and establish a set policy for awards of this kind in order to be consistent in the future.

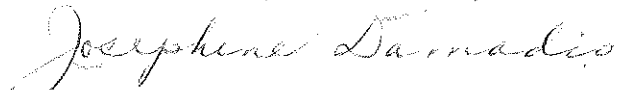

The Brick Township Board of Education held a conference meeting on Wednesday, May 30, 1979 at 7:30 p.m. in the Administration Building for the purpose of discussing items under Building and Grounds, Finance and Business, Curriculum and Instruction and Personnel. Conference

Present were: Mr. Schue, Mrs. Riley, Mr. Bertrand, Mr. D'Ambola, Mrs. Fox, Mrs. Frake, and Mr. Hancock.. (to 10:20 pm)

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Stutts and Mr. Sendzik.
(Rabbi Fierstein, Mr. Benjamin Epstein, Mr. Alan Taubenkimel and Mr. Saul Taubenkimel with others, at 8:00 p.m.)

President Schue announced that the Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon. Sunshine Law

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer and Municipal Clerk on May 24, 1979.

The death of two of our teachers was discussed with those in attendance expressing their sorrow for the incidents and compassion for their families.

A need for a leave of absence, without pay, for a teacher who was injured in an automobile accident was discussed and given board approval by a consensus of opinion.

Mr. Schue advised that he had selected the board members for the various committees and gave the list to the board secretary for inclusion on the June 13th agenda.

At 8:00 p.m. members of the Jewish Community arrived for their scheduled meeting with the board.

Rabbi Fierstein spoke first reiterating their positions on the items of High School Graduation on a Saturday and the observance of Yom Kipper on October 1st. Following Rabbi Fierstein, Mr. Epstein spoke on these two days. Mr. Epstein did state that he realized that changing the scheduled date for the High School Graduation at this time could cause a great inconvenience for many, many people. Mr. Epstein asked if the board would formulate a policy that would make sure that no graduations would be scheduled for Saturday in the future. Mr. Epstein was advised that note was taken of his suggestion.

The board members each spoke briefly of their feelings on the matters discussed. Mr. Schue thanked the group for their attendance and advised that their views, thoughts and desires were respected but that the board had made a decision for this year.

At 8:50 p.m. Mr. Schue advised that the board members were taking a break - that the audience was welcome to remain for the balance of the conference, if they so desired.

At 9:00 p.m. the meeting was resumed. At that time, Dr. Aragona began a discussion of his proposed policy for uncompensated leaves by the Professional Personnel. He explained that he would like this policy approved to develop a consistency in the granting of leaves. He further stated that he wanted the leaves to be of a one-year duration, said leave to start at the beginning of the school year.

The board members discussed this proposed policy, step by step of the sample guide that had been distributed to them and gave Dr. Aragona their direction as to the formulation of this policy to be included, for first reading, on the June 13th Action Agenda.

Mr. Stutts and Mr. D'Ambola briefly referred to their negotiations with representatives of the T.W.U. this afternoon, and asked the board's direction on one particular point regarding leave of absence for a union-elected official.

Mr. Stutts distributed a letter received with regard to the renewal of insurance for the Board of Education. He asked for and was given permission to delay the acceptance of these bids until June 11th at 2:00 p.m. Insurance companies are to be notified of this change of date, and also that bids must be sealed.

Dr. Aragona presented a proposed increase in salary for Substitute Teachers. He proposed \$28. per day for 1-20 days, \$35. per day for 21-60 days, and \$50. per day for 61 days or more. Dr. Aragona explained the problem we have been having getting subs because the surrounding districts pay more than we do. After discussion, these rates were agreed to and he was given direction to include this change, effective September 1, 1979, on the June 13th Agenda.

Dr. Aragona also asked the board to consider employment of six people at \$500.00 each or a total of \$3,000.00 for summer employment to complete a phase of the T & E goals program. The need for these people was spelled out and the board agreed to said summer employment.

Mr. D'Ambola apprised the board members that negotiations with T.W.U. and Central Administration was proceeding well.

The new elementary school to be constructed was briefly referred to as to possible cost including federal monies granted.

At 11:15 p.m. motion was made by Mr. Schue, seconded by Mrs. Riley with unanimous agreement that this meeting be adjourned.

President Schue announced that the Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

Sunshine Law

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer and Municipal Clerk on May 31, 1979.

The agenda items were presented by Dr. Aragona for discussion. Under Building and Grounds, the need for a letter of intent with regard to needed right-of-way by Jersey Central was brought to the floor by Mr. Anton. This is in regard to service for the new high school in process of construction. It was explained that agreement for easement would be presented for board approval at a later date; however, at this time they need a letter of intent in order to go ahead with preparations in this area.

Bid lists which had been prepared after the pre-agenda had been sent to the board members were presented by Mr. Stutts for discussion and approval to be included on the Action Agenda for June 13th.

The insurance program bid to be received on Monday, June 11th at 2:00 p.m. was discussed at length. It was noted that two of the agents who had previously expressed their intent of submitting a bid had advised that they would not be doing so. It was also agreed that the board members would meet with each agent submitting a bid after June 11th to discuss their proposal at length. Mr. Hancock suggested that a Mr. Ackerman be contacted for an evaluation of our insurance coverages and needs in conjunction with the bids to be received. The board members were in agreement that payment would be authorized to pay this man to come out to do this evaluation.

Leaves of absence requested by listed teachers were discussed and explained, in answer to inquiries of board members, by Dr. Aragona and Mr. Wolf. A wording change was agreed to in the motion regarding salary schedule for Substitute Teachers beginning in September, 1979.

Proposed policy with regard to requests for uncompensated leaves of absence by Professional Personnel was discussed and a qualifying phrase added to the original motion in this regard.

Inspectors

The proposed appointment of Medical Inspectors for the 1979-80 school year was discussed by the board members. The need for an additional doctor for more thorough school physicals at an additional cost over the amount now presented was explored. The name of a doctor who might be available to this program was mentioned. The Administration was directed to look into this matter and present their findings to the board at a later date. Also, payment for student physicals for working papers was discussed. Mr. Schue asked that Dr. Aragona find out for him how student religious absences are handled.

Mr. Hancock referred to his March 14th request for information regarding school building roofing bonds for those roofs which need repair or new ones...that contact should be made with bonding companies to see what recourse we have. Mr. Stutts explained what he had done after the original request for information was made and went into detail as to why the roofing bonds on particular buildings were voided or of no value in noted situations.
