Conference

The Brick Township Board of Education held their Pre-Agenda meeting on Tuesday, December 4, 1979 at 7:30 p.m. in the Administration Building.

Present were: Mr. Schue, Mrs. Riley, Mr. Bertrand, Mrs. Fox, and Mrs. Frake.

Also present: Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton, Mr. Sendzik, and Mr. Cardimone.

Sunshine Law

Mr. Schue announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Asbury Park Press, Bulletin Board, Municipal Clerk and Ocean County Times-Observer on November 29, 1979.

The students' selection of colors for Brick Township Memorial High School and their selection of "mascot" were discussed.

Bus Incident

This was followed by a discussion of sequence of events of the bus incident(s) on this date. Mr. Wolf explained in detail what had happened and what tests are to be performed on this vehicle to ascertain the cause of the fumes.

Mr. Cardamone
Insurance

Mr. Robert Cardamone, our Insurance Agent of Record, was present to detail to the board the present liability insurance coverages we have, and the cost of increasing this coverage. He also advised of the 15% difference in cost as to one year coverage cost vs. three year plan. The board did not agree to the three year plan at this time; however, they did agree to increase this coverage to ten million for one year at a total yearly cost of \$3,212.

He further discussed the need for the Board of Education to employ some agency to appraise the school district buildings. A question was asked if such an appraisal would include equipment and supplies within said school buildings and Mr. Cardamone said it would. He estimated that such an appraisal could cost \$10,000. and would be a type of item where we could secure competitive bids. He is to give Mr. Stutts a list of appraisal companies he is familiar with in order that we may compile a list of people to contact for this purpose.

He commended the Brick Township Safety Committee for its accomplishments.

He discussed the status of a suit filed with regard to an incident at Camp Beadleston and is to send Mr. Anton any additional letters or papers he has received.

The outcome of a recent problem with regard to the award of bid for Ice Time was discussed and Mr. Stutts was instructed to be sure there was a certificate of insurance on file from the vendor to whom this bid was to be awarded. Said award is to be included on the December 12, 1979 Action Agenda.

Ice Hockey

The pre-agenda was presented at this time for discussion. Mr. Wolf discussed the need to repaint some of the Special Education vehicles to conform with the regular school buses, and was given agreement that this would be done.

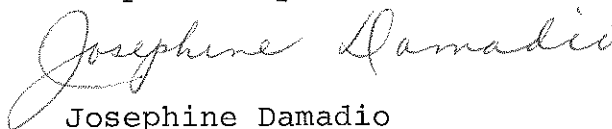
