Mr. Schue discussed with the board his response to Mr. Koczin's letter regarding Soccer fields throughout the school district. No further action was suggested nor recommended by the board.

The board reviewed a letter from Neff and Neff regarding drainage at Laurelton School due to a fence company desiring to open up a business adjacent to the school. Mr. Anton was directed by the board to respond to this letter.

Mr. Stutts reviewed with the board a letter received from School Bus Sales regarding a bid that was awarded to this company. The board authorized a rejection of this bid and the placement of the next lowest bidder on the agenda for the regular meeting to be held on February 14, 1979.

Dr. Aragona gave an overview of the 1979-80 school budget. The board discussed the need to hire a recording secretary for the meetings, other than the pre-agenda and the action agenda meetings. This was referred to Mr. Stutts for review in that such a position would undoubtedly come under Civil Service rules and regulations.

The board discussed the type of P.R. program that might be used in presenting the 1979-80 school budget to the public prior to the budget hearing, and also prior to the actual vote on the budget scheduled for April 3rd.

The board authorized Mr. Stutts to contact various insurance agents to determine those who may be interested in obtaining the insurance for the Brick Board of Education, effective July 1, 1979.

The board scheduled its next meeting for January 30th, 7:30 p.m.

This meeting was adjourned at 10:59 p.m. by motion of Mr. Schue, second by Mrs. Riley and unanimous agreement.
